PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE

VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD AMENDING AND CREATING RULES

VETERINARY EXAMINING BOARD

(CLEARINGHOUSE RULE 86-141)

Pursuant to authority vested in the Veterinary Examining Board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2)(a), and 453.06(1), Stats., the Veterinary Examining Board hereby adopts rules interpreting s. 453.06(1) as follows:

SECTION 1. VE 2.08(1)(intro.) is amended to read:

VE 2.08(1) (intro.) A graduate of a veterinary college approved by the board who meets all requirements for examination may be granted a temporary permit to practice veterinary medicine if the applicant is employed by and practices under the direct supervision of a veterinarian licensed in Wisconsin. Upon receipt of a complete permit application, a review of and determination on the application will be made within 60 business days. Applicants for a temporary permit shall provide the board:

SECTION 2. VE 2.08(2) is created to read:

- (2) A temporary permit shall expire upon:
 - (a) Failure of the examination.
 - (b) Failure to apply for and to take the next scheduled licensing examination.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, pursuant to s. 227.22(2), Stats.
