## ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION AMENDING RULES

An order to amend s. Adm 42.02, relating to a schedule of fees for Nuclear Power Plants.

Analysis prepared by Department of Administration:

1983 Wisconsin Act 393 ratified Wisconsin's membership in the Midwest Interstate Low-Level Radioactive Waste Compact and set up the Wisconsin Low-Level Radioactive Waste Council. The Act set up annual fees and an appropriation for initially joining the Midwest Compact; the Wisconsin Council set up an annual budget. One fourth of all fees are to be paid from GPR funds in the form of a loan to be repaid by nonutility generators of low-level radioactive waste to the GPR account when the Midwest has an operational low-level waste repository site. Three fourths of all fees are to be obtained from program revenue funds. The program revenue funds are to be charged to electric utilities with nuclear reactors. One fourth of the program revenue fee is to be charged to each of the four reactors in Wisconsin.

The work of the Midwest Low-Level Radioactive Waste Compact and the Wisconsin Low-Level Radioactive Waste Council has progressed to the point where the site selection process has begun. The Midwest Compact requires additional funds because the initial funding of the Compact is nearly depleted and because of the need for continuing funding to finance the Compact activities in the site selection process. These include contractor fees, financing an incentive plan and Compact operations. The Wisconsin Council requires additional funds because of the need for additional travel for the Commissioner, more public and informational meetings and for the production of public documents.

SECTION 1. Adm 42.02 is amended to read:

Adm 42.02 SCHEDULE OF FEES. (1) The following is the schedule of fees to be paid by nuclear power plant operators for each nuclear reactor:

Note: Fiscal years run from July 1 of the first year, through June 30 of the second year.

(2) The amounts in the schedule shall be due and payable to the department of administration before the end of the appropriate fiscal year except-the-fiscal-year-1983-84,-which-amount-shall-be-due-within-30-days-of-June-1, 1985.
