

PROCEEDINGS BEFORE THE : BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING OR
MEDICAL EXAMINING BOARD : ADOPTING RULES

ORDER

Pursuant to authority vested in the medical examining board in ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2)(a), and 448.40, Stats., the medical examining board hereby creates rules interpreting s. 448.30, Stats., as follows:

SECTION 1. Med 10.02(2)(v) of the Wisconsin administrative code is created to read:

(v) Failure to inform a patient about the availability of all alternate, viable medical modes of treatment and about the benefits and risks of these treatments, including the benefits and risks associated with the use of extended wear contact lenses.

The rule created and adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22, Stats.
