

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**ORDER OF THE
STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
AMENDING RULES**

1 To renumber PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 d and 3; to renumber and amend PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 b
2 and c; to consolidate, renumber and amend PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 (intro.) and a;
3 to amend PI 8.02 (2) (f) 2, and (j) 2, PI 26.01 and PI 26.03 (intro.), (2) and (5);
4 to repeal and recreate PI 8.01 (2) (h) and (k) 6 (intro.) and PI 26.04; and to create
5 PI 8.001 (5m) and (8m) and PI 8.01 (2) (j) (intro.), relating to school district
6 standards and education for employment.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 121.02 (5) and 227.11, Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 121.02, Stats., as affected by 1987 Wisconsin Act 27

In 1986, the department amended ch. PI 8 and created ch. PI 26, relating to the school district standards and education for employment. Since then, during workshops to assist school districts to implement the standards, the department identified several areas which should be amended. Some of these changes required amendments in the statutes and were included in the department's 1987-89 budget request and subsequently adopted in 1987 Wisconsin Act 27.

1. Standard (f)2 is being amended to change the required number of kindergarten hours from 525 to 437, following the amendment to s. 121.02 (f) 2, Stats.
2. Standard (h) is being amended to remove the requirement for student involvement in the long range library services plan, and the requirement that the plan must "point the direction toward programs described in the current STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL LIBRARY MEDIA PROGRAMS."
3. Standard (j) is being amended to remove the requirement for daily physical education in grades kindergarten through 6, and instead require physical education instruction in these grades at least 3 times weekly.
4. Standard (k) is being amended to phase the required curriculum plans in over 3 years, following amendment of s. 121.02 (1) (k), Stats. Three plans must be developed by September 1, 1988; 3 more by September 1, 1989; and all plans must be developed by September 1, 1990. Computer literacy and environmental education are still required to be integrated throughout other curriculum plans.

5. Standard (L) is being amended to recognize and allow for some of the unique scheduling problems which middle level schools encounter when they attempt to offer exploratory experiences for pupils in foreign languages, vocational areas, and other subjects in preparation for the course offerings of high schools. For middle level schools which offer these exploratory opportunities, "regular instruction" in health, art and general music for grades 5 and 6 must be provided either weekly or for the "equivalent in instructional time and course content;" and in grades 7 and 8, must be offered in sufficient frequency and length to meet the objectives of the curriculum plan under standard (k).
6. Section PI 26.03 (2) is being amended to provide that the education for employment plan which is required under ch. PI 26 must be completed by September 1, 1989, and that it must be implemented by September 1, 1991. The 1987-89 budget amended s. 121.02(1)(m), Stats., to extend the original effective date from September 1, 1988.
7. Chapter PI 26 is being amended to require that data on the basis of sex, race and handicapping condition be included in follow-up studies, and to repeal the requirement that the education for employment plans must be submitted to the Department prior to implementation.
8. Finally, various terms throughout chapter PI 8 are being changed for consistency and clarity throughout the rule and to conform to rule drafting requirements.

1 **SECTION 1.** PI 8.001 (5m) and (8m) are created to read:

2 PI 8.001 (5m) "Direction" includes planning, consultation, inservice training and
3 periodic review.

4 (8m) "Middle level format" means an organizational pattern which includes part or
5 all of grades 5 to 9.

6 **SECTION 2.** PI 8.01 (2) (f) 2 is amended to read:

7 PI 8.01 (2) (f) 2. Each school district board shall annually schedule and hold at least
8 ~~525~~ 437 hours of direct pupil instruction in kindergarten, at least 1,050 hours of direct
9 pupil instruction in grades 1 through 6, and at least 1,137 hours of direct pupil instruction
10 in grades 7 through 12. The school hours are computed as the period from the start to the
10 close of each pupil's daily instructional schedule. Scheduled hours under this subdivision
11 include recess and time for pupils to transfer between classes but do not include the lunch
12 period. No more than 30 minutes per day may be counted for recess. In computing the
13 minimum number of instructional hours under this subdivision, days and parts of days on

1 which parent and teacher conferences are held, staff development or inservice programs
2 are held, schools are closed for inclement weather, or when classes are not held may not
3 be counted.

4 **SECTION 3.** PI 8.01 (2) (h) is repealed and recreated to read:

5 PI 8.01 (2) (h) Library Media Services. Each school district board shall:

6 1. Have on file a written, long-range plan for library services development which
7 has been formulated by teachers, library and audiovisual personnel and administrators, and
8 approved by the school district board.

9 2. Designate a licensed library media person to direct and coordinate the
10 district's library media program.

11 3. Make available to all pupils a current, balanced collection of books, basic
12 reference materials, texts, periodicals, and audiovisual materials which depicts in an
13 accurate and unbiased way the cultural diversity and pluralistic nature of American
14 society.

15 4. Provide library media services to all pupils as follows: to pupils in grades
16 kindergarten through 6, library media services which are performed by or under the direc-
17 tion of licensed library and audiovisual personnel; and to pupils in grades 7 through 12,
18 library media services which are performed by licensed library and audiovisual personnel.

19 **SECTION 4.** PI 8.01 (2) (j) (intro.) is created to read:

20 (j) Health, physical education, art and music. The school district board shall
21 provide instruction in health, physical education, art and music as follows:

22 **SECTION 5.** PI 8.01 (2) (j) 2 is amended to read:

23 2. Physical education instruction shall be provided in accordance with a develop-
24 mental, sequential, comprehensive physical education curriculum and program of
25 instruction for all ~~students~~ pupils. Instruction in grades ~~K-6~~ kindergarten through 6 shall

1 be ~~daily*~~ provided at least 3 times weekly, except that days on which special activities
2 are conducted may be exempt; and shall be conducted by or under the supervision
3 direction of a department-certificated licensed physical education teacher except that 6th
4 graders. Pupils in grade 6 may be scheduled in accordance with the criteria for scheduling
5 grades 7-12 when housed in an organization 7 through 12 if the pupils are attending a
6 school that includes including any of those grades. All students pupils in grades 7-12 7
7 through 12 shall participate in the instructional program of physical education taught by a
8 department-certificated licensed physical education teacher, except that in senior high
9 schools which offer programs based on Life-time Sports one year or the equivalent may be
10 optional to pupils. (*Days on which special activities are conducted may be exempt.)

11 **SECTION 6.** PI 8.01 (2) (k) 6 (intro.) is repealed and recreated to read:

12 PI 8.01 (2) (k) 6. The school district board shall develop sequential curriculum plans
13 in at least 3 of the subject areas specified in subd. 2 by September 1, 1988; in at least 3
14 more of the subject areas specified in subd. 2 by September ¹/₂, 1989; and in all of the
15 remaining subject areas specified in subd. 2 by September 1, 1990. The computer literacy
16 and environmental education curriculum plans shall be developed as follows:

17 **SECTION 7.** PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 (intro.) and a are consolidated, renumbered PI 8.01 (2)
18 (L) 2 (intro.) and amended to read:

19 PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2. In grades 5 through 8, regular instruction shall be provided as
20 follows: ~~In grades 5 and 6, regular instruction shall be provided~~ in reading, language arts,
21 social studies, mathematics, science, physical education, health, art and music. In this
22 subparagraph subdivision, "regular instruction" means instruction each week for the entire
23 school term in sufficient frequency and length to achieve the objectives and allocation of
24 instructional time identified in the curriculum plans developed and adopted under par.
25 (k), except that in middle level formats which offer or require a variety of exploratory

1 experiences for pupils, such as foreign language, business education, vocational
2 agriculture, technology education, home economics education and marketing education,
3 regular instruction in health, art and general music may be provided as follows:

4 **SECTION 8.** PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 b and c are renumbered PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 a and b and
5 amended to read:

6 PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2. a. In grades ~~7 and 8~~, ~~regular instruction shall be provided in~~
7 ~~reading, language arts, social studies, mathematics, science and physical education. In~~
8 ~~this subparagraph, "regular instruction" means instruction~~ 5 and 6, each week for the
9 entire school term, or the equivalent in instructional time and course content, and in
10 sufficient frequency and length to achieve the objectives and allocation of instructional
11 time identified in the curriculum plan developed and adopted under par. (k).

12 b. In grades 7 and 8, ~~regular instruction shall be provided in health, art and~~
13 ~~music. In this subdivision, "regular instruction" means instruction provided in sufficient~~
14 frequency and length to achieve the objectives and allocation of instructional time
15 identified in the curriculum plans developed and adopted under par. (k).

16 **SECTION 9.** PI 8.01 (2) (L) 2 d and 3 are renumbered PI 8.01 (2) (L) 3 and 4.

17 **SECTION 10.** PI 26.01 is amended to read:

18 **PI 26.01 APPLICABILITY AND PURPOSE.** Under s. 121.02 (1) (m), Stats.,
19 beginning in the ~~1988-89~~ 1991-92 school year, every board shall provide access to an
20 education for employment program approved by the state superintendent. The purpose of
21 education for employment programs is to prepare elementary and secondary pupils for
22 employment, to promote cooperation between business and industry and public schools,
23 and to establish a role for public schools in the economic development of Wisconsin.
24 This chapter defines education for employment programs, describes the process for
25 approval of education for employment plans, and establishes approval criteria for
26 education for employment programs.

1 SECTION 11. PI 26.03 (intro.), (2) and (5) are amended to read:

2 PI 26.03 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SCHOOL BOARD PROGRAMS FOR
3 EDUCATION FOR EMPLOYMENT. Under s. 121.02 (1) (m), Stats., by September 1, ~~1988~~
4 1991, and thereafter, every board shall have an education for employment program for
5 elementary and secondary pupils which has been approved by the state superintendent
6 under s. PI 26.04. To be approved, a program shall meet all of the following requirements:

7 (2) The program shall be operated in accordance with an education for employment
8 plan developed by the council and approved by the board by September 1, 1989. The
9 program's long range plan shall be defined in incremental steps and the plan shall be
10 implemented by September 1, 1991. The plan shall be based on pupil needs and interests,
11 equality of educational opportunity, labor market information, impact on economic
12 development and job creation, employment needs, periodic follow-up studies of graduates,
13 and an evaluation of current programs and staff development needs. The plan shall be
14 reviewed annually by the education for employment council, and revised, if necessary, at
15 least once every 5 years.

16 (5) All pupils in grades 9 through 12 shall have access to vocational education
17 programs which have an appropriate curriculum based on labor market information
18 including follow-up studies of graduates on the basis of race, sex, and handicapping
19 condition, job placement and employment needs.

20 SECTION 13. PI 26.04 is repealed and recreated to read:

21 PI 26.04 APPROVAL OF EDUCATION FOR EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS. The state
22 superintendent shall review school district education for employment plans during the
23 school district standards compliance audits under s. PI 8.02. The state superintendent
24 shall approve a program if it meets all of the requirements of s. PI 26.03.

1 **SECTION 14. TERMINOLOGY CHANGES:**

2 (1) Wherever the terms "student" or "students" appear in ss. PI 8.01 (2) (c), (e), and
3 (j) 3 and 4, they shall be replaced by the terms "pupil" or "pupils."

4 (2) Wherever the terms "K-3," "K-6" or "7-12" appear in ss. PI 8.01 (2) (c), (e), and
5 (j) 1., 3., and 4., they shall be replaced by the terms "kindergarten through 3," "kinder-
6 garten through 6," or "7 through 12."

7 (3) Wherever the terms "department certificated" or "certificated" appear in ss.
8 PI 8.01 (2) (c), (d), (e), and (j) 1, 3, and 4, they shall be replaced by the term "licensed."

9 (4) Wherever the terms "supervision and direction" or "supervision" appear in ss. PI
10 8.01 (2) (e), and (j) 1, 3, and 4, they shall be replaced by the term "direction."


11 **SECTION 15. EFFECTIVE DATES:**

12 (1) Treatment of ss. PI 8.001 and PI 8.01 (2) (h) and (j) shall take effect on the
13 first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register
14 as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.

15 (2) Repeal of s. PI 26.04 shall take effect on March 1, 1988.

16 (3) Treatment of ss. PI 8.01 (2) (f) 2, (k), (L) and (m), and ch. PI 26, except repeal
17 of s. PI 26.04, shall take effect on September 1, 1988.
