

ORDER OF THE  
STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION  
CREATING RULES

1           The state superintendent of public instruction creates ch. PI 27, relating to grants  
2 to strengthen family life.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: 1987 Wisconsin Act 27, SECTION 3044 (6g)

Statute interpreted: 1987 Wisconsin Act 27, SECTION 3044 (6g)

Nonstatutory provisions to 1987 Wisconsin Act 27 (the 1987-89 budget) require the state superintendent to establish policies and procedures to award grants to school districts and local governmental units in 1987-88 and 1988-89 to be used to sponsor conferences and learning programs for children and adults which focus on leadership, parenting skills, the principles of family responsibility and the importance of stability of marriage and the home. \$25,000 was included in the department's appropriation for this purpose.

These rules define a local governmental unit as a city, town, village, county or cooperative educational service agency. The rules require that a school district or local government unit submit a proposal in writing, that families of varying characteristics be involved in the development of the proposal; and that the proposal include a plan which includes goals and objectives, local conditions which led to the development of the goals and objectives, schedule of activities, evaluation process, and a budget.

The rules specify that individual grants will range from \$500 to \$5,000, but allow the department to award more than \$5,000 for a proposal which has statewide impact. The department will award grants based on uniqueness and quality of the proposal. Priority will be given to projects which include evidence of cooperative efforts with other school districts and local governmental units, evidence of commitment to ongoing efforts, and/or suitability for use as a model for replication by other school districts and local governmental units. Grants may be used to establish new projects or to supplement current projects.

These rules were promulgated as emergency rules effective October 15, 1987, to enable school districts and local governmental units to apply for grants to celebrate Wisconsin Family Month in November, 1987.

4 **PI 27.04 GRANT AWARDS.** (1) The department shall review all proposals submitted  
5 and shall award grants based on the uniqueness and quality of the proposal. Priority  
6 shall be given to proposals which include one or more of the following:

7 (a) Evidence of cooperative efforts with other school districts and local  
8 governmental units.

9 (b) Evidence of commitment to ongoing efforts beyond the duration of the grant.

10 (c) Suitability of the project as a model to be replicated by other school districts  
11 and local governmental units.

12 (2) Grant awards shall be at least \$500, but may not be more than \$5,000. If the  
13 department determines that a proposed project will have statewide impact, the depart-  
14 ment may award more than \$5,000.


15 (3) The department may request a school district or local governmental unit to re-  
16 submit its proposal with program and budget modifications.

17 (4) A grant may be used to establish a new project or to supplement a current  
18 project.

19 (5) No grant award under this section may be made after December 31, 1988.

These rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication  
in the Wisconsin administrative register, as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
