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ORDER ADOPTING RULE

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

General summary of rule. 1987 Wisconsin Act 3 made a significant change in Wisconsin's Breath Alcohol Testing Program. After January 1, 1988, sec. 343.305(6)(c), Stats., requires that a breath test using an infared testing device shall consist of two samples. This statutory change reflects both a change in the technology and a change in test procedures. The Department of Transportation, Division of State Patrol, administers the statewide breath testing program through the Chemical Test Section. In the last four years, the Chemical Test Section has replaced the outdated breathalyzers, which used a chemical process to detect alcohol, with intoxilyzers that use an infared system to detect alcohol. Under prior law, a person was required to provide only one sample of breath to be analyzed. The new law requires that two breath samples be analyzed. The legislative intent in requiring two samples was to increase the reliability test results as well as the public perception of the Improvements in the technology of instrument's reliability. breath testing instruments mean that this procedure can be done in virtually the same time required to analyze a single sample and with no significant increase in cost. This rule implements these legislatively mandated changes in the breath testing program.

Final regulatory flexibility analysis. This rule will have no impact on small businesses.

<u>Fiscal estimate.</u> The modification of the breath testing program as a result of this rule will not significantly increase any direct or indirect cost in the program.

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Wisconsin department of transportation by s. 85.16(1), Stats., the Wisconsin department of transportation hereby proposes a rule repealing and recreating ch. Trans 311, Wis. Admin. Code, relating to the breath alcohol testing, approval and permit program as follows:

RULE TEXT

SECTION 1. Trans 311.03(4) and (5) are repealed.

SECTION 2. Trans 311.03(6) is renumbered Trans 311.03(4) and as renumbered is amended to read:

Trans 311.03(4) "Calibrating unit" means a device designed to produce a predictable alcohol concentration reading on a breath alcohol test instrument through-the-use-of-a-reference gas.

SECTION 3. Trans 311.03(11) is repealed.

SECTION 4. Trans 311.03(7), (8) and (9) are renumbered Trans 311.03(5), (6) and (7), respectively.

SECTION 5. Trans 311.03(16) is renumbered Trans 311.03(8) and as renumbered is amended to read:

Trans 311.03(8) "System <u>Instrument</u> blank analysis" means a test of a room air sample to insure that the system <u>instrument</u> produces a blank result.

SECTION 6. Trans 311.03(10), (12), (13), (14), (15) and (17) are renumbered Trans 311.03(9), (10), (11), (12), (13) and (14), respectively.

SECTION 7. Trans 311.03(15) is created to read:

Trans 311.03(15) "Test sequence" means one adequate breath analysis, one calibration standard analysis, and a second

adequate breath sample analysis. Each subject test and each calibration standard test shall be preceded and followed by an instrument blank analysis.

SECTION 8. Trans 311.04(1)(c) [Note] is repealed and recreated to read:

NOTE: The following quantitative breath alcohol test instruments are approved for use in Wisconsin:

Breathalyzer, Model 900 Breathalyzer, Model 900A Intoxilyzer Model 5000

The following qualitative breath alcohol test instruments are approved for use in Wisconsin:

Alco - Sensor II Alco - Sensor III Alco - Meter SD-2

SECTION 9. Trans 311.05 [Note] is amended to read:

NOTE: The following calibrating units are approved for use in Wisconsin:

Stephenson Breath Alcohol Simulator Toxitest, Model ABS 120
Smith & Wesson Mark IIA Simulator
Lucky Simulator, Model LS

Guth Simulator 34C

SECTION 10. Trans 311.06(3)(b) is repealed and recreated to read:

Trans 311.06(3)(b) Instrument blank analysis.

SECTION 11. Trans 311.06(3)(d) and (e) are created to read:

Trans 311.06(3)(d) Consecutive breath alcohol analysis
results in a test sequence within .02 grams of alcohol per 210
liters of breath shall be deemed to be an acceptable agreement.
Breath sample analyses failing to meet this criteria shall be deemed deficient.

(e) If the first test sequence is deficient, a second test sequence shall be administered.

SECTION 12. Trans 311.06(4) is renumbered Trans 311.06(5).

SECTION 13. Trans 311.06(5) is renumbered Trans 311.06(4).

SECTION 14. Trans 311.10(1)(b) is amended to read:

Trans 311.10(1)(b) Each test for accuracy shall include but not be limited to a-system an instrument blank analysis and an analysis utilizing a calibrating unit, the result of which shall fall within 0.01 grams of alcohol per 210 liters of-gas of the established reference value.

SECTION 15. Trans 311.10(3) is repealed.

SECTION 16. Trans 311.10(4) is renumbered Trans 311.10(3).

SECTION 17. Trans 311.11(1)(b) is amended to read:

Trans 311.11(1)(b) A permit shall bear the signature, original or facsimile, of the pregram-director chief of chemical test section. "Chief of chemical test section" means the person assigned the responsibility for the administration and supervision of the breath alcohol testing, approval and permit program of the department.

This rule shall take effect upon the first day of the month following publication in accordance with s. 227.22(2), Stats.
