## ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN

## DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, TRADE AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

## ADOPTING, AMENDING OR REPEALING RULES

1 The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture adopts the following 2 order to repeal Ag 10.61(2)(e); to renumber Ag 10.61(2)(f); to 3 renumber and amend Ag 10.61(1), (2)(a) through (2)(d), (2)(g) 4 through (2)(i), and (3) through (5); to amend Ag 10.61 (title); 5 and to create Ag 10.61(1), (3)(h), and (7); relating to poultry 6 disease control.

## Analysis Prepared by the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection

Statutory authority: s. 93.07(1), Stats. Statutes interpreted: ss. 93.07(10), 95.19 and 95.20, Stats.

The amendments to s. Ag 10.61, Wis. Adm. Code broaden the state's poultry disease control program to include species of poultry other than turkeys. The previous rule was applicable only to turkeys. The rule includes all breeding poultry and hatching eggs in a compulsory U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean program and continues mandatory participation of turkey farms in the U.S. Mycoplasma Gallisepticum program. These poultry disease control measures are needed to qualify the State of Wisconsin as a "U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean" state. This classification, granted by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's National Poultry Improvement Plan, is an aid to Wisconsin flock and hatchery owners in exporting breeding poultry, chicks, poults and hatching eggs. A total of 33 states, including all states contiguous with Wisconsin's borders, currently hold this classification.

be used for breeding purposes and no turkey poultry eggs shall may 1 be used for hatching unless they originate from a flock which has 2 3 been tested annually and is classified as follows: "U.S. 4 pullorum-typhoid clean" as provided in the national poultry 5 improvement plan. No turkey species of poultry nor turkey eggs may be used for breeding purposes or hatching unless they origi-6 7 nate from a flock which has been tested annually and is also 8 classified "Mycoplasma gallisepticum clean" as provided in the 9 national poultry improvement plan. 10 National Poultry-Improvement-Plan-(9-CFR-445). 11 12 National-Poultry-Improvement-Plan-(9-GFR-445); 13 14 (b) No person shall may use, sell or otherwise transfer any 15 turkeys poultry or turkey poultry eggs for breeding or hatching 16 purposes unless such turkeys the poultry or turkey poultry eggs comply with the requirements of this section. 17 18 GENERAL PROVISIONS. (a) All blood samples shall be (3) drawn by testing-crews-approved-by an authorized agent of the 19 20 department. 21 (b) All birds turkeys shall be banded at the time blood 22 samples are drawn and blood samples identified by band number. 23 (c) Blood samples drawn from turkeys shall be tested for 24 disease-by-the-department-at-its-diagnostic-laboratories at a 25 laboratory approved by the department. Blood samples drawn from 26 poultry other than turkeys may be field tested by the rapid plate

27 method using approved antigens. Field testing may be conducted by

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1 an authorized agent of the department.

2 (d) Flock Breeder flock and hatchery inspection shall be 3 conducted by the department.

4 SECTION 3. Ag 10.61(2)(e) is repealed.

5 SECTION 4. Ag 10.61(2)(f) through (i), and (3) through (5) 6 are renumbered Ag 10.61(3)(e) through (g) and (i), and (4) through 7 (6) respectively, and as renumbered, Ag 10.61(3)(f), (g) and (1), 8 and (4) through (6) are amended to read:

9 Ag 10.61(3)(f) All <u>breeder</u> flock and hatchery owners shall 10 follow sanitation procedures prescribed by the department.

(g) Flock and hatchery owners shall report any signs of respiratory disease to the department. <u>Isolation of or serolog-</u> ical evidence of pullorum, fowl typhoid and other serotypes of <u>Salmonella in all poultry, and of Mycoplasma gallisepticum in</u> <u>turkeys, shall be reported to the department by any person or</u> <u>laboratory providing poultry disease diagnostic services within</u> 48 hours of obtaining test results.

(1) All turkey flocks classified as reactor, infected or
suspicious shall be quarantined to the premises and may be removed
only directly to slaughter. The flock owner shall furnish proof
of slaughter upon request by the department. <u>The quarantine may</u>
<u>be released following 2 negative tests of the entire flock con-</u>
ducted at least 21 days apart.

(4) PREMISES. No turkey poultry breeding flocks shall may
be commingled with other species of domestic fowl or turkeys or
reared within 100 yards of any other fowl-or turkeys poultry.
(5) HATCHERIES. (a) No operator of a turkey hatchery shall

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1 <u>may</u> hatch any <del>turkey</del> <u>poultry</u> eggs or permit <del>any turkey</del> <u>poultry</u> 2 eggs to be on the hatchery premises unless <del>such</del> the eggs originate 3 from a flock which complies with this section.

4 (b) No eggs of any other species of fowl shall may be 5 hatched in a turkey hatchery.

6 (c) The department shall inspect turkey poultry hatcheries
7 at least once annually.

8 (6) IMPORT REQUIREMENTS. (a) No turkey poultry or turkey 9 poultry eggs shall may be imported into this state unless they 10 originate from flocks which are classified as "U.S. pullorum-11 typhoid clean" as provided in the National Poultry Improvement 12 Plan (9 CFR 445) national poultry improvement plan.

13 (b) Turkey poults less than 2 weeks of age may be imported 14 into this state if they originate directly from hatcheries which 15 hatch no other eggs other than turkey eggs that. Started poultry 16 other than turkey poults may be imported if they originate from 17 hatcheries which hatch no turkey eggs. All eggs shall comply with 18 par. (a) of this subsection. Such-hatcheries Hatcheries shall 19 carry-on comply with sanitation practices approved-by-the-chief 20 livestock-official-of prescribed by the state of origin.

(c) All turkeys, turkey poults poultry, started poultry and turkey poultry eggs imported into this state shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by the chief livestock official of the state of origin certifying that such turkey, turkey poults the poultry, started poultry or turkey poultry eggs originate from flocks or hatcheries which comply with this regulation section or an equivalent mandatory or voluntary program of the state of

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1 origin; provided the department may enter inte. Under a recip2 rocal agreements agreement with other states a state having an
3 equivalent voluntary or mandatory turkey poultry disease control
4 programs providing for other program, the department may approve
5 alternative methods of certification of turkeys certifying poultry
6 and turkey poultry eggs imported into this state.

7 (d) This subsection shall does not apply to turkeys poultry
8 imported into this state which are consigned directly to a slaugh9 tering establishment for immediate slaughter.

SECTION 5. Ag 10.61(1) is created to read:
Ag 10.61(1) DEFINITIONS. As used in this section:

12 (a) "Authorized agent" means any person designated or
13 authorized by the department to collect serological samples and
14 perform blood tests required for control of poultry diseases.

(b) "Flock" means all of the poultry on one farm, except that any group of poultry which has been segregated from other poultry for a period of at least 21 days may, at the discretion of the department, be considered a separate flock.

19 (c) "Hatchery" means the buildings, incubators, hatchers and
20 auxiliary equipment on a premises operated and controlled by a
21 person for the hatching of poultry.

(d) "Mycoplasmosis" means a disease of poultry caused by
<u>Mycoplasma gallisepticum</u>.

(e) "National poultry improvement plan" means the national
poultry improvement plan established by the animal and plant
health inspection service, veterinary services, United States
department of agriculture, under 9 CFR 145.

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(f) "Poultry" means domesticated fowl, including chickens, 1 turkeys, waterfowl, and game birds, except doves and pigeons, 2 which are bred for the primary purpose of producing eggs or meat. 3 4 (g)"Pullorum" means a disease of poultry caused by 5 Salmonella pullorum. 6 (h) "Typhoid" or "fowl typhoid" means a disease of poultry 7 caused by Salmonella gallinarum. 8 SECTION 6. Ag 10.61(3)(h) is created to read: 9 Ag 10.61(3)(h) Upon receipt of a report of pullorum or fowl typhoid in any poultry, or of Mycoplasma gallisepticum in turkeys. 10 the department shall conduct an immediate investigation to deter-11 12 mine the origin and mode of transmission of the infection. Ag 10.61(7) is created to read: 13 SECTION 7. Ag 10.61(7) EXHIBITION. All poultry, except waterfowl, shown in 14 public exhibition shall originate from flocks designated as "U.S. 15 16 Pullorum-Typhoid Clean" under the national poultry improvement plan or from equivalent flocks, or shall have had a negative 17 18 pullorum-typhoid test within 90 days of movement to public exhibi-19 Only sexually mature birds over 4 months of age having a tion. full complement of fully developed adult feathers are required to 20 21 be tested.

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22 SECTION 8. The rules contained in this order shall take 23 effect on the first day of the month following publication in the 24 Wisconsin administrative register, as provided in s. 227.22(2) 25 (intro.), Stats.
