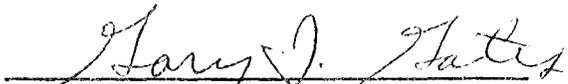

ORDER

EMPLOYEE TRUST FUNDS

To create ETF 10.50, relating to the conversion of sick leave days to credits for paying health insurance premiums.

Analysis

Statutory authority: 1987 Wis. Act 27, Section 688, 40.05(4)(bp)1. and ss. 40.03(1)(m) and (2)(i) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.
Statute interpreted: 1987 Wis. Act 27, Section 688, 40.05(4)(bp)1.

This rule establishes the formula for determining for faculty and academic staff personnel other than those appointed to work either 52 or 39 weeks the number of sick days per year that are convertible to credits for payment of health insurance premiums. The formula takes such faculty and staff's number of hours appointed by the university to work as reported to the Department of Employee Trust Funds, multiplies these hours by a decimal that interpolates in the same ratio the number of days of sick leave credits allowable for part-time faculty and academic staff as the sick leave credits allowable for the 52 or 39 week appointed faculty and staff, producing the number of days of sick leave credits per year with a cap of 8.5 days per year.

SECTION 1. ETF 10.50, is created to read:

SICK LEAVE CONVERSION CREDITS. The amount of accumulated unused sick leave under s. 36.30, Stats., for all faculty and academic staff other than such faculty and staff appointed to work for either 52 or 39 weeks per year in the University of Wisconsin System convertible to credits to pay for health insurance premiums shall equal the number of days resulting from multiplying 0.0040708 times the number of hours per year appointed to work, as reported to the department, rounded off to the nearest tenth of a day. The maximum amount of such unused sick leave shall be limited to 8.5 days per year. The secretary of administration may waive this limitation under s. 40.05(4)(bp)2. and 3., Stats.

Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

The creation of this rule does not affect business.

Fiscal Estimate

The creation of this rule has no fiscal effect.

Effective Date

The creation of this rule takes effect on the first day of the month following its publication in the Wisconsin administrative register pursuant to s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.

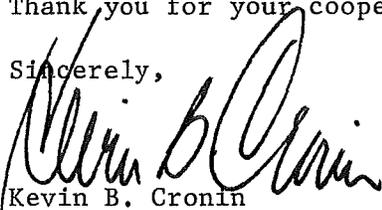
