ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES REPEALING RULES

To repeal PW-PA 20.14, 20.15 and 20.19, relating to aid to counties for administration of public assistance programs and claims by counties and municipalities for general relief paid to persons who do not have legal settlement in the state or who have legal settlement in the state but not in the county or municipality that provides the general relief.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Health and Social Services

This order repeals three Department rules for which there is no longer statutory authority, ss. PW-PA 20.14, 20.15 and 20.19. Section PW-PA 20.14 provides for state aid to counties claiming financial inability to carry out their duties with respect to Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) or general relief. The statute upon which that rule was based was repealed by Chapter 333, Laws of 1973.

The remaining sections, ss. PW-PA 20.15 and 20.19, relate to general relief. Section PW-PA 20.15 relates to state reimbursement to counties providing general relief to state dependents (persons who have not maintained a residence in the state for at least one year before applying for general relief), and s. PW-PA 20.19 relates to administrative hearings conducted on disputes resulting from inaction by a county or municipality on the claims of another county or municipality for reimbursement for general relief paid to a recipient who is said to have legal settlement in the county or municipality presented the claim. These rules are no longer needed because 1985 Wisconsin Acts 29 and 120 eliminated the concept of "legal settlement" and provisions on state dependents from the general relief statutes effective January 1, 1987.

The Department's authority to repeal these rules is set forth in ss.49.02(5m)(e), 49.04(2) and 49.11(7)(a), 1983 Stats., and s.49.52(5), 1971 Stats. The rules interpret ss.49.02(5m), 49.04 and 49.11(7), 1983 Stats., and s.49.52(5), 1971 Stats.

SECTION 1. PW-PA 20.14 and 20.15 are repealed.

SECTION 2. PW-PA 20.19 is repealed.

The repeals contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s.227.22(2), Stats.
