ORDER OF THE PSYCHOLOGY EXAMINING BOARD

ADOPTING RULES Clearinghouse Rule 87-86

#### ORDER

The Psychology Examining Board adopts the following order to amend Psy 3.01(1), Psy 3.02(5) and (15); and to create Psy 3.02(33) and (34), relating to unprofessional conduct by psychology applicants and licensees.

### **ANALYSIS**

Statutory authority: ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2)(a), 455.08, Stats. Statute interpreted: 455.09(1), Stats.

In this order, the Psychology Examining Board amends several rules setting forth unprofessional conduct. It deletes from the definition of "client" under s. Psy 3.01(1) that a person receiving professional services from a psychologist must actually have paid a fee or provided other consideration in order to be considered a "client".

This distinction becomes important in complaints alleging sexual abuse by psychologists where a person receiving psychological services may not have paid a fee. Along these lines, the board also clarifies under s. Psy 3.02(15) that a person is presumed to continue to be a "client" for six months after the termination of professional services. The board believes this clarification also provides better regulation over potential sexual abuse problems where a psychologist-client relationship existed in the recent past.

In other proposed changes, the board extends its disciplinary jurisdiction for criminal conviction of licensees imposed in other states, for failure by licensees to notify the board of criminal convictions, and for having disciplinary action taken against one's license to practice psychology in another state.

### TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Psy 3.01(1) is amended to read:

Psy 3.01(1) "Client" means the individual, group, business, agency, school, organization, or association for whom the licensee of the board provides professional services for a-fee-or-other-consideration which the licensee is usually and customarily compensated. The term client, as defined here, includes the term and concept of "patient".

SECTION 2. Psy 3.02(5) and (15) are amended to read:

Psy 3.02(5) Conviction of a crime resulting-from-or in this state or any other jurisdiction, relating the circumstances of which substantially relate to the licensee's-professional practice of psychology.

Psy 3.02(15) Indulging in sexual intimacies with clients. For purposes of this subsection only, a person shall continue to be a client for 6 months after the termination of professional services.

SECTION 3. Psy 3.02(33) and (34) are created to read:

Psy 3.02(33) Having disciplinary action taken against one's license to practice psychology in another state or jurisdiction.

(34) Failing to notify the board of any criminal conviction against the licensee.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, pursuant to s. 227.22(2)(intro), Stats.
