

AN ORDER to create s. VE 2.12 relating to application requirements for licensees from other jurisdictions.

Analysis prepared by the department of regulation and licensing.

ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08(5)(b), 227.11(2), 453.03, Stats.

Statute interpreted: s. 453.072, Stats.

Related rule: s. VE 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code

License requirements for veterinarians were substantially revised by 1987 Wisconsin Act 39, which became effective on September 1, 1987. New s. 453.072, Stats. permits the board to grant a license to an applicant who is licensed in another country under certain conditions.

Educational standards for applicants seeking an original license in Wisconsin are established by statute. An applicant for an original license must be a graduate of a veterinary college approved by the board or have successfully completed the certification program of the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates of the American Veterinary Medical Association.

Educational standards for applicants who apply as licensees of another jurisdiction are not established by statute. Under Section 453.03, the board may adopt rules relating to licensure qualifications.

This rule requires applicants licensed in another country who are not graduates of a veterinary school approved by the board and not licensed in another state to either: (a) submit evidence of having completed the national board examination and the clinical competency test and a certificate of evaluation of the applicant's educational credentials, or (b) complete the certification program established by the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates of the American Veterinary Medical Association.

ORDER

The Veterinary Examining Board orders as follows:

SECTION 1. VE 2.12 is created to read:

VE 2.12 LICENSEES OF OTHER JURISDICTIONS: GRADUATES OF SCHOOLS NOT APPROVED BY THE BOARD. (1) An applicant for a license under s. 453.072, Stats. who is not a graduate of a school of veterinary medicine approved by the board and who is not licensed in another state shall submit the following:

(a) Evidence satisfactory to the board that the applicant has a current and unrestricted license to practice veterinary medicine in a foreign jurisdiction and has not been disciplined, found liable for malpractice, and is not under investigation or a defendant in a malpractice action as provided in s. 453.072(1), Stats. and either,

(b) Evidence that the applicant has successfully completed the national board examination and the clinical competency test, and a certificate of evaluation of the applicant's educational credentials prepared by an evaluation service provider satisfactory to the board certifying that the applicant's educational credentials are substantially equivalent to those of a graduate of a school of veterinary medicine approved by the board; or,

(c) Evidence that the applicant has successfully completed the certification program of the educational commission for foreign veterinary graduates of the American veterinary medical association.

(2) A school located in another country is approved by the board under this section if the school is evaluated by the Council on Education of the American veterinary medical association and found to meet the criteria of the American veterinary medical association.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22(2)(intro), Stats.
