ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, RENUMBERING AND AMENDING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing s. NR 418.07(1)(b) .
and (c)1., 3. and 4; renumbering s. NR 418.07 .
(1)(c) 2. and 5.; and amending s. NR 418.07 .
(1)(a)(intro.), 1. and 2., (c)2. and (5) of .
the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining .
to the revision of emission limitations for .
certain sources of sulfur dioxide in .
Rhinelander .

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 144.31(1)(a), 144.38 and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 144.31(1)(f), Stats., and the State Implementation Plan (SIP) developed under that provision.

The Department of Natural Resources adopted rules which established air emission limitations for certain sources of sulfur dioxide in Rhinelander in 1984. Changes to some of the emission limits in this rule are necessary because the emission limits for the boilers in this rule do not protect ambient air sulfur dioxide standards. The repealing of certain sections of the rule is necessary, because the sources regulated by those portions of the rule, are no longer operated by the facility. These revisions are necessary for the United States Environmental Protection Agency to approve the State of Wisconsin's SIP for Rhinelander.

SECTION 1. NR 418.07(1)(a)(intro.), 1., and 2. are amended to read:

NR 418.07(1)(a) At any paper mill, pulp mill, or yeast plant or any combination of these sources:

- 1. From any fossil fuel fired steam generating stoker boiler, a maximum of 2.96 1.60 pounds per million BTU heat input and an annual average of 1.77 pounds per million BTU heat input.
- 2. From any fossil fuel fired steam generating cyclone boiler, a maximum of 6.44 3.50 pounds per million BTU heat input and an annual average of 4.51

pounds per million BTU heat input.

SECTION 2. NR 418.07(1)(b) and (c)1., 3. and 4 are repealed.

SECTION 3. NR 418.07(1)(c) 2. and 5. are renumbered NR 418.07(1)(c) 1. and 2.

and NR 418.07(1)(c)2., as renumbered, is amended to read:

NR 418.07(1)(c)2. From any other source not covered by par. (a) or subds. 1. to 4. subd. 1., 0.0 pounds per hour.

SECTION 4. NR 418.07(5) is amended to read:

NR 418.07(5) The owner or operator of a pulp mill subject to sub.

(1)(a) or (b) shall notify the department in writing 30 days prior to resumption or shut down of pulp manufacturing.

The foregoing rules were approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on November 17, 1988

The rules shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
