

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
 RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

 IN THE MATTER of renumbering s. NR 20.03(1)(a)8. .
 and 9.; amending s. NR 20.03(1)(a)3.; repealing .
 and recreating s. NR 20.04(4)(a)5.; and creating .
 s. NR 20.03(1)(a)8., Wisconsin Administrative . FM-18-88
 Code, pertaining to smallmouth bass fishing on .
 Palette and Nebish Lakes, Vilas County .

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174(3), 227.11(2)(a) and 227.116(2)(e), Stats.
 Statutes interpreted: s. 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

The order establishes a 16-inch minimum size limit and a daily bag limit of 2 fish for smallmouth bass on Palette lake, Vilas county, and it establishes a protected slot size of 9 to 12 inches and a daily bag limit of 5 fish for smallmouth bass on Nebish lake, Vilas county.

SECTION 1. NR 20.03(1)(a)3. is amended to read:

Kind of fish and locality	Open season (both dates inclusive)	Daily bag limit	Minimum length (inches)
3. Nebish lake (sec. 11, T41N, R7E), Vilas county (smallmouth bass)	Continuous	None <u>5</u>	<u>10 No minimum length except the possession of fish between 9 and 12 inches is prohibited</u>

SECTION 2. NR 20.03(1)(a)8. and 9. are renumbered to be NR 20.03(1)(a)9. and 10.

SECTION 3. NR 20.03(1)(a)8. is created to read:

Kind of fish and locality	Open season (both dates inclusive)	Daily bag limit	Minimum length (inches)
8. Palette lake (sec. 3, T41N, R7E), Vilas county (smallmouth bass)	Continuous	2	16

SECTION 4. NR 20.04(4)(a)5. is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 20.04(4)(a)5. There is a continuous open season with no daily bag limit or size limit for all species of fish contained in these waters except for the following: In Nebish lake, no person may take smallmouth bass from 9 to 12 inches long and there is a daily bag limit of 5 for smallmouth bass; in Palette lake, no person may take smallmouth bass less than 16 inches long, there is a daily bag limit of 2 for smallmouth bass and there is no open season through 1991 for lake trout; and in Spruce lake, no person may take largemouth bass less than 12 inches long and there is a daily bag limit of 2 for largemouth bass.

The foregoing rule was approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on January 26, 1989.

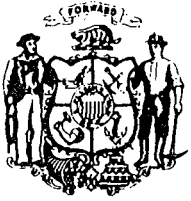
The rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
