## EXCLUSION LIST OF CONDITIONS THAT ARE NOT REPORTABLE\*

List of isolated defects considered normal variants when found in isolation

Accessory auricle (drop ear tags)  
Accessory nipple (supernumerary nipple, or skin tag)  
Cervical rib  
Clinodactyly (incurving of 5th finger)  
Cryptorchidism (see undescended testicle)  
Diastasis recti  
Epicanthal folds  
Esotropia  
Flammeus nevus  
Flat bridge of nose  
Fontanelle (large or small)  
Gum cysts, including congenital epulis, ranula, mucocele  
Hemangioma  
Hemolytic disease of the newborn (RH disease)  
Hydroceles  
Hymenal tags  
Hypoplastic scrotum (if birth weight is less than 2,500 grams)  
Incurving fingers (clinodactyly)  
Long fingers and toes  
Low set ears  
Meckel's diverticulum  
Mongolian spots  
Nasal lacrimal duct obstruction  
Natal teeth  
Overriding sutures  
Phimosis  
Polydactyly in blacks (Postaxial, Type B)  
Posteriorly rotated ears  
Rectal fissures  
Redundant foreskin  
Single umbilical artery  
Syndactyly of 2nd and 3rd toe  
Thymic hypertrophy  
Tibial torsion  
Tongue tie  
Umbilical cord atrophy  
Umbilical hernias (completely covered by skin)  
Undescended testicle or cryptorchidism if birth weight is less than 2500 grams  
Vaginal cysts  
Vaginal tags  
Webbing of neck  
Widely spaced nipples
