ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, RENUMBERING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of repealing ss. NR 10.06(2)(c) and (5); renumbering ss. NR 10.01(3)(e)1.d., 15.022(6)(b), (8) and (11); amending ss. NR 10.01(2)(b)1., (3)(e)1.(intro.), (3)(e)1.a., (e) 2. The Department proposes to establish the following hunting and trapping rule modifications:

- 1. Buckshot use Expand buckshot use to include portions of December.
- 2. Handgun use Allow certain caliber handguns for bear hunting.
- 3. Gray partridge hunting (2 proposals) Extend the hunting season through December 31 and close Clark, Marathon and Taylor Counties.
- Fisher trapping Expand the area open to fisher trapping.
- 5. Sharp-tailed grouse hunting (2 proposals) Reduce the daily bag limit and establish one closed area.
- 6. Hunting hours Establish uniform small game, turkey and big game hunting hours.
- 7. Deer hunting Adjust 12 unit overwinter goals, 4 unit boundaries and 3 county firearm use options.
- 8. Goose hunting Reduce the New Auburn Canada goose management zone.

9. Game refuges - Expand the refuge protection on 4 state-owned properties.

NR 10.09(1)(a)2. Size. Possess or have in control while hunting, shells containing shot larger than no. BB <u>during the period commencing on</u> June 1 <u>through December-31</u>, <u>and ending 48 hours following gun deer season closure established in s. NR 10.01(3)(e) or 10.117, whichever is later, except during the open season established in s. NR 10.01(1)(b), (c), (d) and (g) when nontoxic shot size BBB and T may be used for hunting migratory game birds.</u>

NR 10.09(1)(c)1.c. Deer or bear may be hunted with handguns loaded with .357, .41 and .44 magnum caliber cartridges or any other caliber handgun chambered for commercially manufactured cartridges which produce a minimum muzzle energy of 1000 foot pounds. Such handguns shall have a minimum barrel length of 5 1/2 inches measured from the muzzle to the firing pin with the action closed.

Note: Persons under the age of 18 years, pursuant to s. 941.22, Stats., may not hunt with handguns. Hunters using handguns must comply with all state and federal laws respecting handguns, including s. 941.23, Stats., respecting concealment, and s. 29.224, Stats., respecting transportation.






