

ORDER OF THE  
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION CREATING RULES

To create chapter PSC 173, Wis. Adm. Code, regulating the provision of and charges for 911 emergency telephone service.

ANALYSIS PREPARED BY THE  
PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN

Sec. 146.70, as affected by 1987 Wis. Act 27, authorizes counties in Wisconsin to contract with telecommunications utilities for the provision of 911 emergency telephone service and to bill utility customers for the cost of the system. The charge for such a system is passed on to each customer in the customer's monthly telephone bill.

Sec. 146.70(3)(i), Wis. Stats., requires the telecommunications utility providing the 911 emergency service to submit its contract with a county to provide the 911 emergency service to the public service commission, which may disapprove the contract within 60 days under certain conditions: if the contract is not compensatory, is excessive, or does not comply with the utility's filed rate schedule.

These proposed rules implement the requirements of sec. 146.70, Stats., and set out specific requirements which must be met by telecommunications utilities which submit 911 emergency service contracts for commission review. Specific provisions of the rules include:

(1) A requirement that telecommunications utilities submit contracts with counties for 911 emergency service to the PSC within 20 days of entry. The rule specifies what information must be submitted with the contract.

(2) A provision allowing any person to request that the commission disapprove the contract, setting forth the procedure for doing so. The rules set up a standing notice list for
