ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AMENDING RULES

The state superintendent of public instruction hereby amends PI 11.24 (7)

(b) 4, relating to physical therapy for pupils with exceptional educational needs.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 227.16 (2) (b) and 448.04 (1) (e), Stats.

Statute interpreted: s. 448.04 (1) (e), Stats.

1989 Wisconsin Act 31 amended s. 448.04 (1) (e), Stats., to enable a physical therapist to provide physical therapy services in schools, without a prescription, to children with exceptional educational needs if the services are provided pursuant to the department's rules. This proposed amendment to ch. PI 11.24 (7) (b) 4 will bring the rule into compliance with s. 448.04 (1) (e), Stats., as amended.

This rule is being promulgated as a technical amendment under s. 227.16 (2) (b), Stats, as renumbered by Clearinghouse Rule 89-143.

SECTION 1. PI 11.24 (7) (b) 4 is amended to read:

PI 11.24 (7) (b) 4. The physical therapist shall have adequate medical information and-medical-prescription regarding a child from a licensed physician on-the-appropriate-division-form before a the child is enrolled in the a program. There shall be a-reciprocal an exchange of medical and social information between the division and local professional personnel who are concerned with the child's school placement and total health needs. The district-shall-obtain-an-updated-medical-prescription-and-information-yearly or-more-often-if-there-is-a-change-in-the-child's-physical-condition, e.g., surgery, casting, etc.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect upon publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
