ORDER

An order of the Hearing Aid Dealers and Fitters Examining Board to repeal Had 2.01 (6) and chapter Had 6 and to amend Had 2.01 (4) of the administrative code relating to trainees and access to records of the board.

ANALYSIS

Statutory authority: ss. 15.08 (5) (b), 227.11 (2) (a), 459.12, Stats.
Statutes interpreted: ss. 459.01 (7) and 459.07, Stats.

In this proposed rule-making order the Hearing Aid Dealers and Fitters Examining Board is repealing Had 2.01 (6) which indicates that applicants for trainee permits will be expected to have knowledge of information relating to the selling and fitting of hearing aids contained in materials which the board has available. The board does not have such material on hand for applicants to obtain and study, therefore this language is being repealed.

The repeal of Had 6 would eliminate that chapter relating to access to records of the board. Current language is antiquated and unnecessary as the "Freedom of Information legislation," found in subch. II of ch. 19, Stats., clearly spells out what records are public and the department rules explain the custodial responsibility of all records.

In Had 2.01 (4) the effective date of April 1, 1975 is being deleted as well as deletion of the grandfather clause of noncancellation or revocation that is relative to that effective date of April 1, 1975.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Had 2.01 (4) is amended to read:

Had 2.01 (4) ~~Effective April 1, 1975, only~~ Only one trainee at a time may hold a trainee permit to practice fitting of hearing aids under the supervision of a given licensee ~~except that a trainee permit outstanding on the effective date of this subsection will not be cancelled or revoked by reason of this subsection.~~

SECTION 2. Had 2.01 (6) and chapter Had 6 are repealed.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro), Stats.
