

(e) Transfer to the department of natural resources for the well compensation program; and

(f) Other programs, including the DNR environmental repair fund, that may be specified by statute.

(1m) VAPOR RECOVERY GRANT PROGRAM. Beginning on September 1, 1991, the department shall charge an oil inspection fee, in addition to any other fees, of \$0.50 for each 50 gallons from which petroleum product samples were taken for the vapor recovery grant program. No fees may be charged under this subsection after October 31, 1992.

(2) SPECIFIED FEES AS LIENS ON PRODUCT INSPECTED. The fees specified in this section shall be a lien on the products inspected.

(3) PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF S. 168.05, STATS. In addition to the penalties specified under s. 168.15, Stats., when the department identifies a violation of the statutory provisions of s. 168.05, Stats., it shall charge a fee based upon the following schedule:

(a) 1. For the first violation identified during the calendar year, \$0.50 for each 50 gallons of petroleum product imported or received into the state;

2. For the second violation identified during the calendar year, twice the fee specified in subd. 1.; and

3. For the third and subsequent violations identified during the calendar year, three times the inspection fee specified in subd. 1.

(b) If the department is notified within 60 days of the violation of s. 168.05, Stats., by the person who imported or received the petroleum product, a fee of \$0.50 for each 50 gallons of petroleum product imported or received into the state shall be charged.

(4) CERTIFICATION FEE FOR PETROLEUM PRODUCT USERS. (a) Persons applying for certification or recertification as a petroleum product user shall submit with the application for certification or recertification an annual fee, determined from the date of certification, of \$270.00 for each separate storage location.

(b) Certified petroleum product users are exempt from the payment of the segment of the \$0.50 fee which is used to fund the administration of the petroleum inspection program. The certified petroleum product user shall remit to the department the remaining segment of the \$0.50 fee. The amount of the total fee determined to be the funding for the petroleum inspection program is \$0.035.

Fees for the examination of plans and site inspections for self-service stations or stations using key, card or code operated dispensing devices shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.12. Tank installation fees for such stations shall be in accordance with Table 69.10.

Ind 69.125 Certification of UST system specialities. All applicants for certification as a UST system installer, tightness tester, or remover, cleaner, reliner, inspector or site assessment provider shall submit, with the application form, fees as specified in this section.

(1) **APPLICATION AND INITIAL CERTIFICATION.** Persons applying for certification in one or more of the categories specified in sub. (2), shall submit a fee of \$100.00 for each 2 categories for which certification is requested.

(2) **CATEGORIES OF CERTIFICATION.** Persons may be certified in one or more of the following categories:

- (a) Installer;
- (b) Remover;
- (c) Tightness tester;
- (d) Cleaner;
- (e) Reliner;
- (f) Inspector; or
- (g) Site assessment provider.

(3) **EXAMINATION.** Upon determination of eligibility for examination for certification, fees shall be submitted for examination and reexamination as follows:

- (a) Initial examination \$10.00 per category
- (b) Examination retakes \$10.00 per examination per category

(4) **EXAMINATION AND TRAINING SEMINARS.** Fees shall be assessed on an individual basis from education and training programs the department sponsors or participates in.

(5) **RE-CERTIFICATION.** The recertification fee for 2 categories of certification shall be \$100.00 per person.

Ind 69.13 Ski lifts and towing devices. (1) **PLAN EXAMINATION FEE.** Fees for the examination of plans for ski lifts and towing devices shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.13-1.

(b) The cost of complaint investigation tests conducted by the department in accordance with s. Ind 14.03 (8), shall be computed on the basis of \$20.00 per hour plus actual travel expenses or \$100 per test whichever is greater.

Ind 69.20 Certification of certified inspectors, dwelling code inspectors and independent inspection agencies. All applicants for certification as a certified inspector, dwelling code inspector or independent inspection agency shall submit, with the application form, fees as specified in this section.

(1) **CERTIFIED INSPECTOR.** (a) *Application and initial certification.* Persons applying for certification in one or more of the categories specified in par. (b) shall submit a fee of \$25.00.

(b) *Categories of certification.* Persons may be certified in one or more of the following categories:

1. Dwelling Construction Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 26.05 (3) (a);
2. Dwelling Energy Conservation Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 26.05 (3) (b);
3. Dwelling Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 26.05 (3) (c);
4. Dwelling Electrical Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 26.05 (3) (d);
5. Plumbing Inspector I as defined in s. ILHR 81.31 (3);
6. Plumbing Inspector II as defined in s. ILHR 81.31 (4);
7. Plumbing Inspector III as defined in s. ILHR 81.31 (5);
8. Commercial Electrical Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 17.05 (5);
9. Commercial Building Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 26.05 (3) (e); and
10. Rental Unit Energy Inspector as defined in s. ILHR 68.04 (3).

(c) *Examination.* Upon determination of eligibility for examination for certification as a certified inspector, fees shall be submitted for examination and reexamination as follows:

1. Initial examination \$10.00 per category
2. Examination retakes \$10.00 per examination

(d) *Education and training seminars.* Fees shall be assessed on an individual basis for education and training programs the department sponsors or participates in.

(e) *Recertification.* The annual recertification fee for a certified inspector in one or more categories of certification shall be \$25.00 per person.

(2) **DWELLING CODE INSPECTOR.** Any person who is certified in all dwelling code inspection categories and wishes to provide inspection ser-

VICES as a dwelling code inspector, may be certified by the department upon payment of a fee. In order to qualify as a dwelling code inspector, the applicant must be certified in the categories of dwelling construction; dwelling heating, ventilating and air conditioning; dwelling energy conservation; dwelling electrical; and plumbing inspector I. The fee for initial certification and annual recertification shall be \$10.00. This fee shall be in addition to the fee specified in sub. (1).

(3) INDEPENDENT INSPECTION AGENCY. Fees for the initial certification or recertification of an independent inspection agency to perform any or all of the inspection services outlined under sub. (1) (b) shall be assessed annually at the cost of \$216.00.

Ind 69.21 One- and 2-family dwellings and manufactured dwellings. (1) UNIFORM BUILDING PERMIT SEAL. A fee of \$22.00 shall be remitted to the department or its agent at the time of application for a Wisconsin Uniform Building Permit Seal for a new dwelling. A fee shall not be required for additions or alterations to dwellings. Municipalities enforcing the Uniform Dwelling Code shall purchase one \$22.00 permit seal for each new dwelling falling within the scope of the Uniform Dwelling Code.

(2) PERMIT TO START CONSTRUCTION. Where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code, a fee of \$27.00 shall be remitted at the time of application for a permit to start construction of footings and foundation.

(3) DEPARTMENTAL PLAN REVIEW. The following fees for plan review of dwellings or their alterations or additions shall apply where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code, and may be applied when the department is requested by a municipality to assist in the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Dwelling Code:

(a) Where employes of the department review plans the fee shall be assessed and computed on the basis of \$22.00 per hour or \$43.00 per plan whichever is greater.

(b) Where an independent inspection agency under contract to the department reviews plans, the fees established in the contract shall defray the actual cost of the service.

(4) DEPARTMENTAL INSPECTIONS. The following fees for on-site inspections shall apply where the department administers and enforces the Uniform Dwelling Code, and may be applied when the department is requested by a municipality to assist in the administration and enforcement of the Uniform Dwelling Code:

(a) Where employes of the department perform on-site inspections, the fee shall be assessed and computed on the basis of \$22.00 per hour plus actual travel expenses with a minimum fee of \$108.00 per required inspection payable in advance of issuing the building permit.

(b) Where employes of the department perform on-site enforcement-related inspections as a result of consumer complaints, contractor requests or requests by any individuals in municipalities where permits are not issued and inspections are not performed, a fee shall be assessed to

the individual requesting the inspection at the rate of \$22.00 per hour plus actual travel expenses with a minimum fee of \$108.00 payable in advance of the inspection.

(c) Where an independent inspection agency under contract to the department performs inspections, the fees established in the contract shall defray the actual cost of the service.

(5) **MANUFACTURED DWELLINGS.** Except as provided in pars. (a) and (b), where employes of the department perform plan reviews, plant evaluations, consumer complaint investigations or any other type of enforcement related activity for manufactured dwellings, the manufacturer shall be assessed at the rate of \$22.00 per hour plus actual travel expenses.

(a) The minimum fee for plan review shall be \$43.00.

(b) The minimum fee for inspections shall be \$108.00.

(6) **WISCONSIN INSIGNIA.** Fees for Wisconsin insignias for manufactured dwellings shall be assessed and computed on the basis of \$22.00 for each dwelling unit.

(7) **MATERIAL AND PRODUCT REVIEWS - APPROVAL NUMBERS.** A fee determined in accordance with s. Ind 69.09 (2) shall be assessed where approval numbers are issued by the department for the approval of materials, equipment, devices, and methods of construction.

(8) **MISCELLANEOUS FEES.** When the department provides goods or services not specifically covered by the above fees, fees may be charged to persons or organizations requesting such goods and services based upon actual cost.

Ind 69.22 Platting-subdivision without public sewers. (1) APPLICATION. The fees for department plat review and investigations of subdivisions not served by public sewers conducted in accordance with ch. ILHR 85, and ch. 236, Stats., shall be determined as follows:

(a) *Plat reviews.* The fee for an initial plat submission shall be computed on the basis of \$20.00 per lot.

(b) *Resubmitted plats.* The fee for a resubmitted plat shall be \$50.00 per plat.

(c) *Field investigations.* The fee for any field investigation requested by the subdivider shall be \$300.00 per day or fraction thereof per subdivision.

(d) *Groundwater monitoring review.* The fee for department review of groundwater monitoring data shall be \$100 per subdivision.

(2) **COLLECTION OF FEES.** All fees shall be remitted to the department at the time that the plats are submitted for review or when field investi-

gations are requested or conducted. No plat certifications shall be made until the fees are received by the department.

Ind 69.23 Plumbing and private sewage systems. (1) PLUMBING PLAN EXAMINATION FEES. (a) *Applicability.* Plan examination fees for preliminary or complete plans shall accompany the plans and specifications when submitted. If the department determines upon review of the plans that inadequate fees were provided, the necessary additional fee shall be provided prior to departmental approval.

(b) *Examination fees.* The plan examination fee shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.23-1.
