ORDER

An order of the Chiropractic Examining Board to amend Chir 5.01 (2) of the administrative code relating to continuing education requirements for chiropractic licensure.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b), 227.11 (2) (a) and 446.02 (1) (b), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 446.02 (1) (b), Stats.

In this order, the Chiropractic Examining Board proposes to permit chiropractors to count up to 8 continuing education contact hours acquired in one licensing period toward the continuing education contact hours required in the next licensing period, if the board imposes specific topic requirements which must be met during the licensing period in which the specific requirements are imposed and the new requirement requires a chiropractor to exceed 24 hours of continuing education in the licensing period in which the requirement is imposed. The board also proposes to limit the application of continuing education hours acquired in response to a board order in a disciplinary proceeding.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. -Chir 5.01 (2) is amended to read:

Chir 5.01 (2) Continuing education contact hours may apply only to the biennial registration period in which the contact hours are acquired, except that no more than 8 contact hours acquired in fulfillment of continuing education requirements created by the board during the biennial registration period in which the board requires the acquisition of the hours may be carried over to the next biennial registration period, to the extent that acquisition of board specified contact hours in one or more board specified topic areas requires a chiropractor to exceed 24 continuing education contact hours in any biennial registration period. Continuing education contact hours required of a particular chiropractor as part of a disciplinary proceeding, informal settlement conference, or resolution of an investigation into the conduct or competence of the chiropractor may not be counted towards the fulfillment of generally applicable continuing education requirements, and may not be carried over into the next biennial registration period.

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
