ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD RENUMBERING, AMENDING AND CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER OF amending ss. NR 20.02(1)(e)(3) and 20.03(1)(c)(title), (f)4. and (k)(title); renumbering ss. NR 20.03(1)(a)10., (c)10., (d)8. and (k)2. and 26.09(57)(c); and creating ss. NR 20.03(1)(a)10., (c)10., (d)8. and (k)2. and 26.05(51)(d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to sport fishing and fish refuges ...

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174(3), and 227.11(2)(a), Stats. Statutes interpreted: ss. 29.085 and 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

In this order, SECTION 1 makes the daily bag limit 0 (catch and release) for smallmouth bass on Lake Superior from the first Saturday in May until the Saturday nearest June 20;

SECTIONS 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 and 8 establish continuous open seasons, aggregate daily bag limits of 1 gamefish (largemouth and smallmouth bass; walleye, sauger and hybrids thereof; and northern pike) and 10 panfish (bluegill, crappie, pumpkinseed (sunfish), yellow perch and bullheads) and no minimum size limits for these species on urban waters (Trout in urban waters are already covered by separate rules.);

SECTION 5 increases the minimum size limit for rainbow trout (steelhead) from the current 12 inches to 26 inches on all Lake Superior tributaries, including the Brule river, from their mouths upstream to the first dam or impassable barrier;

SECTION 9 creates a refuge on Round Lake in an area where the department will create a walleye spawning reef; and

SECTION 10 changes the refuge below the Arpin dam on the Chippewa river from a spring refuge to a year-round refuge.

Cranberry river from its mouth upstream to the Lenawee road (T50N, R7W, sec. 28); north fork Fish creek (T47N, R5W, sec. 1) from its mouth upstream to the junction with Pine creek (T47N, R6W, sec. 13); Flag river from its mouth upstream to the junction with the east fork of Flag river; Iron river from its mouth upstream to Orienta dam; Sioux river from its mouth upstream to Big Rock falls (T49N, R4W, sec. 19); Siskowitt Siskiwit river from its mouth upstream to second bridge (T51N, R6W, sec. 35).

DOUGLAS COUNTY:

Brule river from its mouth upstream to the U.S. hwy. 2 bridge crossing; Amnicon river from its mouth upstream to Amnicon falls; Middle river from its mouth upstream to U.S. hwy. 2; Nemadji river from its mouth

Saturday nearest April 1 to the day before the first Saturday in May and October 1 to November 15, but <u>fishing in the</u> Brule river, excluding taking smelt with gear specified in s. NR 20.09(3)(b), is prohibited one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise.
