ORDER OF THE OPTOMETRY EXAMINING BOARD ADOPTING RULES

(CLEARINGHOUSE RULE 92-97)

#### ORDER

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:

An order of the Optometry Examining Board to amend Opt 6.04 (2), (4) and (5); to repeal and recreate Opt 6.06; and to create Opt 6.07, 6.08 and ch. Opt 7 of the administrative code relating to the renewal of TPA certificates, and the initial grant and renewal of certificates of registration.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

### ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b), 227. 11 (2) and 449.18 (7), Stats., and s. 440.08 (3) (b), Stats., as created by SECTION 3305 of 1991 Wisconsin Act 39.

Statutes interpreted: ss. 440.08 (3) (b), 449.06 (1) and 449.18 (4) and (7), Stats.

These rules are being proposed as a result of amendments to ch. 440, Stats., as affected by 1991 Wisconsin Act 39, which authorize the Department of Regulation and Licensing to implement a uniform procedure for renewal of credentials issued under chs. 440 to 459, Stats. The statute also authorizes the board to adopt rules relating to renewal of credentials.

Subsections Opt 6.04 (2), (4) and (5) relate to continuing education requirements for optometrists certified under s. 449.18, Stats., to use therapeutic pharmaceutical agents and to remove foreign bodies from an eye or from an appendage to the eye. Optometrists are required to provide proof of completion of continuing education coursework at the time of renewal of a TPA certificate. Subsections Opt. 6.04 (2) and (4) are being amended to delete the references in the rules to s. Opt 6.06, and to include instead references to s. Opt 6.08. Section Opt 6.06 is being repealed and recreated to identify the general requirements for renewal of credentials, and s. Opt 6.08 is being created to identify specific requirements for late renewal.

Subsection Opt 6.04 (5) permits an optometrist who is granted a TPA certificate within a biennium to submit proof of completion of one hour of continuing education per month or partial month of certification. The rule as amended will make it clear that the reporting procedures in s. Opt 6.04 (5) relate only to initial certification, and do not apply to credential renewal.

Section Opt 6.06 is being repealed and recreated to specify the general requirements for renewal of TPA certificates. The procedure contained in s. Opt 6.06 relating to reinstatement of a lapsed certificate is being revised and will be set forth in proposed s. Opt 6.08.

Section Opt 6.07 is being created to inform credential holders who fail to renew their TPA certificates by the renewal date that they may not practice under the certificate until the certificate is restored in accordance with the procedure proposed in s. Opt 6.08.

Section Opt 6.08 is being created to identify specific requirements for late renewal of a TPA certificate. The rule incorporates the procedure for renewal set forth in s. 440.08 (3), Stats., as affected by 1991 Wisconsin Act 39.

Chapter Opt 7 is being created to specify the procedure for renewal of the certificate of registration issued to optometrists pursuant to s. 449.06, Stats. The rule incorporates the procedure for late renewal of credentials set forth in s. 440.08 (3), Stats., as affected by 1991 Wisconsin Act 39.

## TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. Opt 6.04 (2), (4) and (5) are amended to read:

- Opt 6.04 (2) Continuing education hours may be applied only to the biennial registration period in which the continuing education hours are acquired, unless-permission-has-been-granted-by-the-board-under-eonditions specified-in except as provided under s. Opt 6.08, to apply credits to the previous biennium to satisfy requirements for reinstatement of a certificate which has lapsed.
- (4) A <u>TPA</u> certificate holder as-specified-in-s--0pt-6-02-(4) who fails to meet the continuing education requirements by the renewal deadline may not use therapeutic pharmaceuticals or remove superficial foreign bodies from the eye or from an appendage to the eye after the renewal deadline until the certificate is reinstated as-defined-in under s. Opt 6-06 6.08 and-as referenced-in-s--449-07.-Stats.
- (5) Optometrists <u>initially</u> certified under s. 449.18, Stats., within a biennium<sub>T</sub>-must <u>shall</u> submit to the board proof of completion of one hour of board approved continuing education per month or partial month of certification reported on or before January 1 of the biennium. A minimum of one-quarter of the continuing education hours must be in the diagnosis and management of glaucoma.
  - SECTION 2. Opt 6.06 is repealed and recreated to read:
- Opt 6.06 <u>RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE</u>. TPA certificates expire on January 1 of each even-numbered year. Renewal applications shall be submitted on a form provided by the department on or before the renewal date specified in s. 440.08 (2) (a) 54, Stats., along with proof of completion of the continuing education requirements specified in s. Opt 6.04.
  - SECTION 3. Opt 6.07 and 6.08 are created to read:
- Opt 6.07 <u>FAILURE TO RENEW</u>. An optometrist who fails to renew a TPA certificate by the renewal date may not use therapeutic pharmaceutical agents or remove foreign bodies from an eye or from an appendage to the eye until the certificate is restored under s. Opt 6.08.

- Opt 6.08 <u>LATE RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE</u>. An optometrist who fails to renew a TPA certificate by the renewal date may restore the TPA certificate by submitting an application on a form provided by the department, and satisfying the following requirements:
- (1) If applying less than 5 years after the renewal date, submit proof of completion of 30 hours of continuing education coursework as required under s. Opt. 6.04.
- (2) If applying 5 years or more after the renewal date, submit proof of completion of 30 hours of continuing education coursework as required under s. Opt 6.04, and proof of:
- (a) Successful completion of educational coursework required by the board to ensure protection of the public health, safety and welfare, and
- (b) Successful completion of an examination required by the board to ensure protection of the public health, safety and welfare.

SECTION 4. Chapter Opt 7 is created to read:

## CHAPTER OPT 7 (title)

#### CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION

- Opt 7.01 <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. In this chapter, "department" means the department of regulation and licensing.
- Opt 7.02 <u>CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION</u>. Persons practicing optometry are required to hold a valid certificate of registration.
- Opt 7.03 <u>RENEWAL OF CERTIFICATE</u>. Persons practicing optometry shall on or before January 1 of each even-numbered year renew their certificates of registration by registering with the department and paying the renewal fee specified in s. 440.08 (2) (a), Stats.
- Opt 7.04 <u>FAILURE TO RENEW</u>. An optometrist who fails to renew a certificate of registration by the renewal date may not practice optometry, until the certificate is restored under s. Opt. 7.05.
- Opt 7.05 <u>LATE RENEWAL</u>. An optometrist who fails to renew a certificate of registration by the renewal date may restore the certificate by satisfying the following requirements:
- (1) If applying less than 5 years after the renewal date, submit an application on a form provided by the department and pay the renewal fee specified in s. 440.08 (2) (a), Stats.
- (2) If applying 5 years or more after the renewal date, submit an application on a form provided by the department, pay the renewal fee specified in s. 440.08 (2) (a), Stats., and submit proof of:
- (a) Successful completion of educational coursework required by the board to ensure protection of the public health, safety and welfare, and

board to		pletion of an examination required by the public health, safety and welfare.
