ORDER OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION AMENDING RULES

The state superintendent of public instruction hereby repeals PI 3.25(3)(a)6, renumbers PI 3.25(3)(a)7, amends PI 3.25(1)(intro.), (3)(a)(intro.), (b)(intro.) and 4, PI 3.26, PI 3.27(title), (1)(intro.), (a) and (2), PI 3.28(title), (1)(intro.) and (2), PI 3.29(title), (1)(intro.) and (2), PI 3.30(title) and (1)(intro.), PI 3.31(title), (1)(intro.), (2) and PI 4.07, and creates PI 3.03(6)(b) 4 and (c) and PI 3.355, relating to an audiologist and special 3-year license, reduction of credits for certain special education licenses and the authorization of a portfolio review process.

ANALYSIS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Statutory authority: ss. 115.28 (7) (c), 121.02 (1) (a) and 227.11 (2) (a), Stats.

Statute interpreted: ss. 115.28 (7) and 118.19 (1) and (3) (a), Stats.

Section 115.28 (7), Stats., requires the state superintendent of public instruction to license all teachers for the public schools and to make rules establishing standards of attainment for licensure. Chapter PI 3 contains the requirements which an individual must meet to be licensed in Wisconsin. The amendments to ch. PI 3:

- 1. Creates a school audiologist license
- 2. Creates a special 3-year license
- 3. Reduces the number of credits necessary to receive a license in certain areas of special education.

The amendments to ch. PI 4 allows Wisconsin's teacher education institutions to establish a portfolio review process.

School Audiologist License

The rules establish minimum requirements for audiologists providing services to children in school districts. The rules will permit:

- 1. Any person who holds a masters degree in audiology from an accredited institution and who has been successfully employed by a school or school district as a school audiologist prior to July 1, 1994, on a full-time basis for two semesters, or the equivalent, to be issued a school audiologist license.
- 2. Any person who holds a masters degree in audiology from an institution accredited by the educational standards board of the American speech-language-hearing association may receive a permit to serve as a school audiologist.

The desired effect of the rules is to license school audiologists in order to facilitate the development of a statewide school audiology services delivery system as well as to provide state categorical aids to reimburse the salaries

of school audiologists.

Currently, the salaries of persons serving as school audiologists are funded through local funds, federal special education entitlement or discretionary funds, or a combination of the two. A few are categorically aided because they happen to hold a license as a special education teacher. The creation of a new license for school audiologists under the rules will enable the salaries of all persons serving and licensed as such to be reimbursed under state categorical aids as provided for under s. 115.88 (1), Stats., since licensure is required in order to receive state categorical aids.

Special 3-Year License

The rules establish a special 3-year, non-renewable license which authorizes the holder to teach in the areas of emotional disturbance or learning disabilities if certain conditions are met. This special license will be effective no later than June 30, 1998 and will not be issued after June 30, 1995. This special license is created to allow persons who are currently or need to be licensed with an emergency license to receive a 3-year regular license while they complete coursework needed to obtain a regular license to teach in the areas of emotional disturbance or learning disabilities.

Reduction of Credits

The rules reduce the number of credits necessary to receive a license to teach in the areas of mild or moderate cognitive disabilities, severely handicapped, learning disabilities, emotional disturbance, hearing impaired and visually impaired.

Portfolio Review

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The rules allow a Wisconsin institution to waive specific requirements in ch. PI 3 based on a portfolio review of a student's previous experience and training. The portfolio review process must be part of the institution's approved program.

SECTION 1. PI 3.03(6)(b)4 and (c) are created to read:

PI 3.03(6)(b)4. 'School audiologist permit.' a. A one-year school audiologist permit which authorizes the holder to be employed as a school audiologist may be issued to a person who meets the requirements under s. PI 3.355 (1) (b) and who seeks a license as a school audiologist but does not meet the license requirements under s. PI 3.355. A permit issued under this subparagraph is valid for a period not to exceed one year and expires on June 30, unless an earlier expiration is stated in the permit.

b. The district administrator or designated official of the employing school district shall request a permit in writing with full explanation and justification of the need. The request shall state that a search was conducted for a fully-licensed school audiologist and that a fully-licensed audiologist is not available.

c. The district administrator or designated official of the employing school district may request that a permit be renewed. This permit may be renewed if, between the date of issuance and the proposed renewal date, the applicant satisfactorily completes at least 6 semester credits towards completion of the requirements under s. PI 3.355 (1) (a).

- d. The state superintendent may issue or deny a permit under this subdivision.
 - (c) <u>Special three-year license</u>. 1. Effective July 1, 1993, a special three-year, non-renewable license which authorizes a licensed teacher to teach in the areas of emotional disturbance or learning disabilities may be issued if all of the following conditions are met:
- a. A request for a license is made as specified under par. (a)2.
 - b. The applicant is enrolled in an approved program leading to a regular license under ss. PI 3.28 or 3.29 and the enrolling institution certifies that the program can be completed within the three-year time period of the special license.
 - 2. The applicant under subd. 1b may submit a portfolio for review by an institution to determine if any of the requirements under ss. PI 3.28 or 3.29 may be waived by the institution under s. PI 4.07.
 - 3. The applicant under subd. 1b shall student teach on the job for a maximum of two semester credits. The requirement under this subdivision may be waived by the institution based on the portfolio review under subd. 2.
 - 4. The applicant under subd. 1b shall complete 1/3 of the regular license requirements under ss. PI 3.28 or 3.29 each year and shall submit evidence of successful teaching experiences by the employing school district to the state superintendent. If the applicant does not meet the requirements under this subdivision, the special license may be rescinded by the state superintendent.
- 5. A special license issued under this paragraph will remain in effect no later than June 30, 1998.
 - 6. A special license under this paragraph will not be issued after June

 - (a) At least 12 semester credits in professional education course work including all of the following:
 - 1. The requirements in PI 3.05 (1), (2m), (8), (9), and (10).
- 2. Educational psychology including principles and theories of
 learning.
 - 3. Methods and procedures in school audiology programs including the relationship with, and content of school pupil service programs. This requirement may be met by prior experience upon the recommendation of the accredited institution.
 - 4. Alternative communication systems including signed language systems, their implications for the social, emotional and educational development of children, and methods for effective communication with children who use them.
 - 5. At least 50 hours of supervised practicum providing audiology services in a school setting, or equivalent experience while employed as a school audiologist by a public or private school or school district.
 - (b) A master's degree in audiology from an institution accredited by the educational standards board of the American speech-language-hearing association.
 - (2) A person who holds a masters degree in audiology from any accredited institution and who has been successfully employed by a school or school district as a school audiologist prior to July 1, 1994, on a full-time basis for two semesters, or the equivalent, may be issued a regular license under this section.
- 31 (3) A person who meets the requirement under sub. (1)(b), may be issued

a permit under s. PI 3.03(6)(b)4.

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SECTION 12. PI 4.07 is amended to read:

PI 4.07 LICENSURE RULES. Each professional education program leading to licensure shall require completion of all requirements for licensure at the specific grade level and in the specific subject area as specified in ch. PI

3. The SCD may review the previous experience and training of each student through a portfolio review process and may waive specific requirements in ch.

PI 3 or this chapter based upon this review. Authorization for the portfolio review process shall be part of the SCD program that is approved by the state superintendent.

The rules contained in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month commencing after the date of publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register, as provided in s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
