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

RULES in FINAL DRAFT FORM

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Rule No.: ILHR 17.14 (4)(d)
Relating to: Electrical Inspection of Farms
Clearinghouse Rule No.: 92-139

The Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations proposes an order to create ILHR 17.14 (4) (d), relating to electrical inspection of farms.

Analysis of Proposed Rules

Statutory Authority: Section 101.82 (1), Stats.
Statutes Interpreted: Section 101.82 (1), Stats.

Section 101.82 (1) of the Wisconsin Statutes requires the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations to adopt rules for the inspection of electrical construction of places where farming is conducted.

Chapter ILHR 17 contains the department's current administrative rules relating to electrical inspection. The proposed rule consists of an addition to chapter ILHR 17 in order to comply with section 101.82 (1), Stats.

The proposed farm inspection rule states that the department may inspect electrical construction on farms. Under this proposal, inspection of electrical construction on farms would not be mandatory but could be performed upon request or if there is a problem or a legitimate complaint.

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SECTION 1. ILHR 17.14 (4) (d) is created to read:

ILHR 17.14 (4) (d) Farm inspections. The department may inspect electrical construction on farms.


