Rule: ______ 84.30-9 Relating to: Polybutylene Pipe for Water Distribution Systems The Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations proposes an order to renumber Tables 84.60 - 10 and 84.60 - 11; to amend Tables 84.30-9 and 84.30-11; and to create ILHR 84.30 (4) (g) and Table 84.60 - 10, relating to polybutylene pipe for water distribution systems.

Analysis of Proposed Rules

Statutory authority: ss. 101.02 (1), 101.63 (1), 101.73 (1) and 145.02 (2), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 145.02 (1) and (3), Stats.

The Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations is responsible for the supervision of plumbing in order to safeguard public health. This responsibility has been delegated to the Safety and Buildings Division which administers and enforces the state Plumbing Code, chapters ILHR 81 to 86.

Chapter ILHR 84 of the Plumbing Code establishes minimum standards which govern the quality and installation of materials, fixtures, appliances, appurtenances and equipment to be used in plumbing systems. The proposed rule expands the use of polybutylene as one of several acceptable piping materials for water distribution systems.

In 1985 the department proposed rules which included polybutylene pipe as an acceptable material for water distribution systems. During the rule-making process several concerns were raised relative to polybutylene's suitability for this use. Ultimately, all controversies relating to polybutylene were resolved with the interested parties, except for the question of the material's durability. The department has recently completed durability assessment studies for polybutylene and recommends allowing the use of polybutylene pipe for hot and cold water distribution systems with the exception of continuously circulated portions of hot water distribution systems. The department also recommends discontinuing the use of acetal male insert fittings for joining polybutylene piping in hot and cold water distribution systems. SECTION 4. Tables 84.60 - 10 and 84.60 - 11 are renumbered 84.60 - 11 and 84.60 - 12.
