An order of the Examining Board of Architects, Professional Engineers, Designers and Land Surveyors to amend A-E 4.08 (1) (b) and (c) of the administrative code relating to the principles and practice examination and the barrier free design examination for professional engineers.

Analysis prepared by the Department of Regulation and Licensing.

ANALYSIS

Statutes authorizing promulgation: ss. 15.08 (5) (b) and 227.11 (2), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: s. 443.09 (5), Stats.

In this proposed rule-making order the Examining Board of Architects, Professional Engineers, Designers and Land Surveyors is deleting the reference to the information that describes the sections of the barrier free examination and inaccurately describes the principles and practice examination contents. This change will accurately reflect what sections make up the principles and practice examination.

Section A-E 4.08 (1) (c) is also amended to include the fact that knowledge of relevant statutes, rules and regulations are included in the barrier free design examination.

TEXT OF RULE

SECTION 1. A-E 4.08 (1) (b) and (c) are amended to read:

A-E 4.08 (1) (b) The principles and practice examination requires the ability to apply engineering principles and judgment to problems in general engineering fields such as chemical, civil, electrical and mechanical fields. Questions-involving-economic-analysis-and-the-design-needs-of-people-with physical-disabilities-and-relevant-statutes-and-eodes-shall-be-included.--The duration-of-the-examination-is-8-hours,-administered-in-one-day.

(c) The barrier free design examination requires the applicant to demonstrate knowledge of the design relevant statutes, rules and regulations relating to the needs of people with physical disabilities.

(END OF TEXT OF RULE)

The rules adopted in this order shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register, pursuant to s. 227.22 (2) (intro.), Stats.
