ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD AMENDING RULES

IN THE MATTER of amending ss. NR 20.10(1)(b) (intro.), 21.02(2), 21.04(2)(d), (3)(c), (7)(b) (8)(a), (11)(a) and (13), 21.08(intro.), 22.02(2) FM-19-93 and 22.12(7) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code pertaining to sport and commercial fishing on Wisconsin-Minnesota and Wisconsin-Iowa boundary waters

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: Sections 29.174 (3), and 227.11 (2) (a), Stats.

Statutes interpreted: Sections 29.085 and 29.174 (2) (a), Stats.

In this order, as a precautionary measure, SECTIONS 1 and 4 prohibit the harvest of minnows or shiners from the St. Louis river to reduce the possibility of bait-bucket transfer of the exotic Ruffe.

SECTIONS 2, 5 and 6 liberalize the commercial fishing rules on the Wisconsin-Minnesota and Wisconsin-Iowa boundary waters by eliminating the minimum length limit for commercially harvested bullheads and extending the commercial frame net season on Wisconsin-Iowa boundary waters from September 1 to June 1.

SECTION 3 closes the lake sturgeon angling season upstream from St. Croix Falls on the St. Croix river and the shovelnose sturgeon season on the St. Louis and St. Croix rivers and the Mississippi river north of Red Wing, Minnesota.

SECTION 3 also resolves interstate differences in the opening day of the walleye and northern pike season on the St. Louis river by changing to a "Saturday 2 weeks prior to the Saturday nearest Memorial Day" opener, and opening the muskellunge season on the St. Croix and Mississippi rivers on the "Saturday nearest Memorial Day."

Finally, SECTION 3 eliminates a potential rule conflict by cross-referencing the extended trout and salmon seasons on the St. Louis river (April 1 - November 15).

SECTION 1. NR 20.10(1)(b)(intro.) is amended to read:

NR 20.10(1)(b)(intro.) Except as provided in ss. NR 20.09(2)(g) and (3), and 21.06(1)(d), no person may take fish other than smelt and shiners with nets or traps from Lake Superior, its bays or tributaries, and no person may take minnows or shiners from the St. Louis river. This paragraph does not apply to the following waters:

SECTION 2. NR 21.02(2) is amended to read:

NR 21.02(2) Commercial fish include species of rough and detrimental fish as defined by this chapter, shovelnose (hackleback) sturgeon 25 inches and over in length taken only on setlines, catfish 15 inches or over in length or 12 inches or over dressed and bullheads 9 inches or over in length or 7 inches or over dressed of any length when taken with commercial fishing gear and all taken while fishing under a commercial fishing license on the Mississippi river.

SECTION 3. NR 21.04(2)(d), (3)(c), (7)(b), (8)(a), (11)(a) and (13) are amended to read:

SECTION 4. NR 21.08(intro.) is amended to read:

NR 21.08(intro.) Except as provided in ss. NR 20.09(2)(g) and (3) and 21.06(1)(d), no person may take fish other than smelt and shiners with nets or traps in the St. Louis River river. No person may take minnows or shiners from the St. Louis river.

Only those minnow seines, minnow dip nets, cast nets, minnow traps or crayfish scoops described below and operated in the manner specified may be used for the taking of minnows: (23.11, 29;137, 29.085)

SECTION 5. NR 22.02(2) is amended to read:

NR 22.02(2) "Commercial fish" means species of rough and detrimental fish as defined in this chapter, shovelnose (hackleback) sturgeon 25 inches and over in length, catfish 15 inches or over in length or 12 inches or over dressed and bullheads 9 inches or over in length or 7 inches or over dressed of any length when taken with commercial fishing gear under a commercial fishing license.

SECTION 6. NR 22.12(7) is amended to read:
