

IN THE MATTER OF an Order Adopting Rule AMENDING s. Trans 326.01(intro.) and to CREATING s. 326.01(7), Wisconsin Administrative Code, relating to motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials.

ORDER ADOPTING RULE

Analysis Prepared by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation

STATUTORY AUTHORITY: s. 227.11, Stats.

STATUTES INTERPRETED: ss. 110.07, 110.075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats.

General Summary of Rule. Chapter Trans 326 adopted motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials of the United States Department of Transportation in effect on October 1, 1992. This amendment changes the date from October 1, 1992 to November 1, 1993. This change allows Wisconsin to enforce the most recent version of the motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials. All vehicles operating in interstate commerce are already subject under federal law to any changes that have been adopted between October 1, 1992 and November 1, 1993.

Fiscal Effect. This rule amendment will not have a fiscal effect upon the state, any local governments nor the private sector.

Final Regulatory Flexibility Analysis. This rule amendment will not have any significant adverse effect on small businesses.

TEXT OF RULE

Under the authority vested in the state of Wisconsin, department of transportation, by s. 227.11, Stats., the department of transportation hereby amends a rule interpreting ss. 110.07, 110.075, 194.38 and 194.43, Stats., relating to motor carrier safety requirements for transportation of hazardous materials.

SECTION 1. Trans 326.01(intro.) is amended to read:

TRANS 326.01 FEDERAL RULES ADOPTED. The following federal regulations adopted by the United States department of transportation and in effect on November 1, ~~1992~~ 1993, are adopted by the department and shall be enforced in relation to those carriers, drivers or vehicles to which these federal rules apply in the same manner as though the federal regulations were set out in full in this ~~rule~~ chapter:


SECTION 2. Trans 326.01(7) is created to read:

Trans 326.01(7) Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, part 180, qualification and maintenance of cargo tanks.




Effective Date. This rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Register as provided in s. 227.22 (2), Stats.


