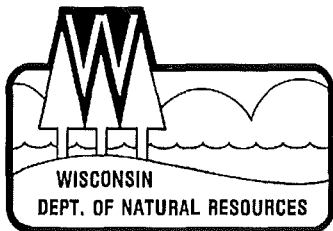

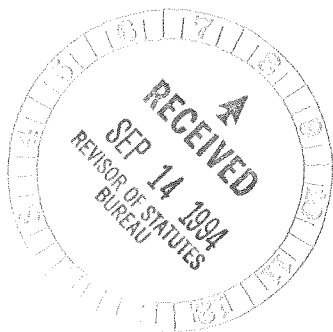

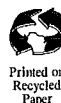

ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD
CREATING RULES

IN THE MATTER of creating s. NR 26.08(5)(a) of the
Wisconsin administrative code relating to the
establishment of a refuge on Duck creek, Brown county

Analysis Prepared by Department of Natural Resources

Statutory authority: ss. 29.174(1) and 227.11(2)(a), Stats.
Statutes interpreted: s. 29.174(2)(a), Stats.

This rule creates a fish refuge in Duck Creek in Brown County from March 1 of each year to the date immediately preceding the opening date of the general fishing season.

SECTION 1. NR 26.08(5)(a) is created to read:

NR 26.08(5) BROWN COUNTY. (a) Duck creek. That part of Duck creek beginning at the first dam upstream of the foot bridge in Brown county Pamperin park located in the village of Howard, section 20, T24N, R20E and extending downstream 650 feet.

Note: The creation of a refuge on Duck creek is not intended to alter the jurisdictional relationship that otherwise exists between the state and the Oneida tribe.

The foregoing rule was approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on July 21, 1994.

The rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.
