- s. 440.08 (3) (b) The...interested examing board...may promulgate rules requiring the holder of a credential who fails to renew the credential within 5 years after its renewal date to complete requirements in order to restore the credential, in addition t the applicable requirements for renewal established under chs. 440 to 480, that ...the examining board...determines are necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare. The rules may not require the holder to complete educational requirements or pass examinations that are more extensive than the educational or examination requirements that must be completed in order to obtain an initial credential from the...examining board.
- s. 450.02 (3) (b) The board may promulgate rules necessary for the administration and enforcement of this chapter and ch. 961.
