# Wisconsin Department of Revenue Advisory on Alcohol Mist/Vapor Machines in Wisconsin

**Guidance Document Number: 100006** 

This is a proposed guidance document. The document has been submitted to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Administrative Register for public comment as provided by <u>sec. 227.112(1)</u> Wis. Stats.

The Alcohol & Tobacco Enforcement Unit at the Wisconsin Department of Revenue has recently become aware of alcohol mist/alcohol vapor machines being advertised or available for sale to Wisconsin consumers. These machines allow the user to inhale the mist of alcohol beverages, and some machines also vaporize the alcohol for inhalation by the user. Inhalation is done usually through a balloon or other device that allows the user to inhale the mist or vapor. Below is a picture of one of these machines:

Please be aware that the use of these machines at licensed premises in Wisconsin is illegal. "Class B" intoxicating liquor licenses authorize the retail sale of alcohol beverages to be consumed only by the glass (sec. 125.51(3), Wis. Stats.). Also, Wisconsin law prohibits introduction of a hazardous substance such as alcohol into the human body in a manner not intended by the manufacturers, and in a manner intended to induce intoxication (sec. 941.316(2), Wis. Stats.).

Any person violating any of these statutes is subject to fines, imprisonment, and/or suspension/revocation of their alcohol beverage license or permit. In addition, authorized personnel within the department, or any peace officer, may confiscate these machines and any alcohol beverages used within them.
