The proposed rules create provisions necessary to administer the VORP program.</p>

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Illinois statutes provide appropriations for grant programs to entities to provide mobile assistance units to provide outreach services to veterans. Iowa statutes provide appropriations for the Iowa Veterans Trust Fund that may be used for counseling, housing assistance, and other outreach activities. Michigan statutes provide appropriations for the Michigan Veterans Trust Fund and may be used to provide temporary financial assistance to veterans. The Minnesota "Support Our Troops" account may be used for outreach activities.

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
