In response to the **#COVID19** pandemic, Wisconsin **#DMV** is launching two **#innovative** programs to shift common tasks normally done in-person, to tasks that can be done online.

About 80,000 people have had their **#driver** licenses expire during the **#health** emergency. Each week that passes, another 10,000 licenses expire, creating a large queue of people needing service. **#Wisconsin #DMV** will now allow people to renew their driver licenses online. **#DMVs** in other states have had success with similar programs.

During the **#pandemic**, more than 10,000 **#teen** drivers have been unable to take their **#road** tests. The DMV normally conducts about 2,000 road tests per week. 98-percent of 16-17-year-olds pass the test on the first or second attempt. For that reason, Wisconsin DMV will now allow families of teen drivers who have successfully completed driver training requirements the option to waive their teens' road test. The teen would then be issued a probationary license.

Both programs start May 11, 2020 and will help DMV more **#efficiently** serve its **#customers** while keeping **#publicsafety** at the forefront. https://bit.ly/DMV_Pilots
