- -#CDLdrivers with expired FedMed cards may continue #driving until the COVID19 #healthemergency passes. The license will remain valid and no violation will be issued.
- -CDLs that expire during the pandemic response will be automatically extended 60 days and late fees will be waived. The #driver record, visible to #lawenforcement, will show that the driver license is valid.
- -Drivers can take the CDL skills exam two days after obtaining a #Commercial Learners Permit, instead of 14 days. New drivers can practice with a CDL holder in the backseat to promote #socialdistancing.
