PROPOSED PERMANENT RULE No. CR 20-020**

Initial Regulatory Flexibility Analysis: The proposed rule would require BAIDs installed in Wisconsin to include features not currently required in this state, such as a camera and

communications technology. Local service centers would be required to train their installers and service professionals on how to install and service these new features. The businesses would need to make modifications to their installation procedures to implement installation of devices with these new features. The department expects this would have a one-time effect on small businesses that act as service providers.
