The statement of scope for this rule, SS 022-21 was approved by the Governor on February 19, 2021, published in Register No. 783A1 on March 1, 2021, and approved by the Natural Resources Board on May 26, 2021. This rule was approved by the Governor on June 15, 2023.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

1. Statutes Interpreted: The department has interpreted ss. 29.014 (1), 29.041, 29.516 (2) (d), and 29.519, Stats., as authorizing this rule.

2. Statutory Authority: Sections 29.014 (1), 29.041, and 29.519, Stats., authorize these rules, and s. 29.516 (2) (d), Stats., describes the methods for marking commercial fishing nets and is cross-referenced in this rule.

3. Explanation of Agency Authority:

Under s. 29.014 (1), Stats., "Rule-making for this chapter," the department is directed to establish and maintain conditions governing the taking of fish that will conserve the fish supply and ensure the citizens of this state continued opportunities for good fishing.

Section 29.041, Stats., provides that the department may regulate fishing on and in all interstate boundary waters and outlying waters.

Section 29.519, Stats., provides that the department may regulate the commercial fishery, including through harvest limits, formulas for allocation of harvest limits among licensees, allotment of individual licensee catch quotas, gear regulations, and restricted fishing areas, and authorizes the department to determine the method of submission of all required reports and records. These rules are established in ch. NR 25, Wis. Admin. Code.

4. Related Statutes or Rules:

None apply.

5. Plain Language Analysis:

The purpose of this rule is to restructure, reorganize and simplify ch. NR 25, "Commercial Fishing – Outlying Waters." These changes will aid the department and stakeholders in interpreting and implementing this chapter. This rule will not impose new regulations on commercial fishers, and changes will be of a minor nature.

SECTION 1 revises the title of ch. NR 25 to appropriately reflect the contents of the chapter.

SECTION 2 creates a new subchapter for the general provisions of ch. NR 25.

SECTION 3 clarifies that the purpose of the chapter is not only to regulate commercial fishing in outlying waters, but also to regulate wholesale fish dealers doing business in Wisconsin. Wholesale fish dealer regulations have long been included in this chapter, but the organization of ch. NR 25 has not accurately reflected that wholesale fish dealers include both Wisconsin commercial fishers and other entities that are not commercial fishers.

SECTIONS 4, 5, and 6 add and revise references to rule provisions that are applicable to treaty fishers in the absence of a Lake Superior fishing agreement and are being renumbered and reorganized in this rule.

SECTIONS 7, 8, 10 to 13, 15, 16, 18 to 30, and 32 to 62 renumber existing definitions to place them in a new commercial fishing subchapter.

SECTION 9 renumbers the definition of catch-per-unit-of-effort to place it in a new commercial fishing subchapter, and amends the definition to include CPE, a commonly used acronym.

SECTION 14 renumbers the definition of "commercial fishing gear" to place it in a new commercial fishing subchapter, and amends the definition to remove unnecessary language relating to recreational fishing gear that is not regulated under this chapter.

SECTION 17 modifies the definition of "condition of the fish" to clarify that "description of the fish" is a term also commonly used for the same purpose.

SECTION 31 renumbers the definition of "high value species" to place it in the commercial fishing subchapter, and amends the definition to clarify that in any zone where a commercial fisher's individual catch quota is less than 13,656 pounds, whitefish are considered to be a high-value species.

SECTION 63 creates a new subchapter to better organize the regulations specific to commercial fishers and commercial fishing in outlying waters. This subchapter contains the definitions that are renumbered in the sections above.

SECTION 64 creates the definitions section in Subchapter II, which contains the definitions renumbered in the sections above, and also creates a definition of "home use fisher," a term that is used in this chapter but has not previously been defined.

SECTION 65 modifies the description of the yellow perch fishing seasons in Green Bay to be less confusing, and adds a map to better illustrate the restrictions.

SECTION 66 corrects the date of the end of the commercial ice fishing season to be March 31, which is the last day in March.

SECTION 67 removes the reference to feet in favor of the equivalency in miles to improve consistency in measurement units throughout the chapter, reconciles language on transferring lake trout tags with the existing ability for fishers to transfer lake trout quota on Lake Superior, and corrects a cross-reference.

SECTION 68 and 70 clarify language relating to gear restrictions at certain times of the year and depths to reduce use of the passive voice, make the existing language easier to read and understand, and remove the references to days as a measurement of time in favor of hours, which are more specific. SECTION 68 also clarifies that these gear requirements would apply to treaty fishers as well, in the absence of a Lake Superior fishing agreement. SECTION 70 also clarifies the statutory gill net marking requirements that apply for Lake Superior and clarifies an existing rule provision relating to gill net placement when trap nets are set illegally in the "all nets" gear restriction category for Lake Superior.

SECTION 69 repeals a duplicative provision that is already stated in s. NR 25.09 (1) (am) 3. f.

SECTIONS 71 and 73 clarify language relating to gear restrictions to reduce use of the passive voice and make the existing language easier to read and understand, and remove the references to days as a measurement of time in favor of hours, which are more specific.

SECTION 72 moves existing language on lifting gill nets with a mesh size greater than $2\frac{3}{4}$ inch stretch measure in Lake Michigan in water less than 25 fathoms into a new, separate provision to better separate the rules from gill nets in Lake Michigan that are $2\frac{3}{4}$ inch stretch measure or less.

SECTION 74 clarifies language on the restriction on pound or trap nets in specific areas of Lake Michigan from June 29 to Labor Day to more clearly state the requirements for using these nets during this timeframe and for removing the net webbing, and adds a map of where the restrictions apply.

SECTION 75 clarifies language and marking requirements for pound and trap nets so that each net is marked with the license number or fleet reporting number of the licensee using the net rather than the person to whom the net belongs, who may be a different person.

SECTION 76 clarifies language relating to gear restrictions for seines to reduce use of the passive voice.

SECTION 77 repeals a provision for fishing with seines that is being merged with existing seine provisions.

SECTIONS 78 and 79 reduce use of the passive voice in language on the use of trawls in southern Green Bay, and consolidate language on where trawls may be used into the introductory language of the subdivision (in SECTION 78) rather than in a separate provision (which is repealed in SECTION 79).

SECTION 80 clarifies language relating to trawling gear restrictions to reduce use of the passive voice and duplicative language that is already stated earlier in the paragraph, and adds a map of the area where trawling is allowed.

SECTION 81 specifies that the lead line coordinates rather than the king line coordinates of trap nets must be reported. This would facilitate trap net reporting for commercial fishers, as they more often utilize lead line coordinates in their operations. In combination with the pot coordinates, the lead line coordinates provide an accurate representation of the layout of the net.

SECTION 82 removes an obsolete reference to statutes, removes an obsolete geographical point of reference, rectifies incorrect coordinates, and removes redundant geographical references for restricted areas in Lake Superior and Lake Michigan. This section also clarifies that applicants for a restricted area

permit must complete the application form with all information required by the department on the form.

SECTIONS 83, 84 and 85 renumber existing provisions relating to lake trout tagging and identification, wholesale fish dealer reports, and vehicle identification requirements to reorganize them into the appropriate subchapters.

SECTION 86 organizes existing wholesale fish dealer regulations into a new subchapter.

SECTION 87 adds a definition of "wholesale fish dealer" based on the statutory definition since the term is used in this chapter of administrative code, and clarifies the relationship of the statutory definition to commercial fishing licensees.

6. Summary of, and Comparison with, Existing or Proposed Federal Statutes and Regulations:

No federal statutes or regulations apply. States possess inherent authority to manage the fishery and wildlife resources located within their boundaries, except insofar as preempted by federal treaties and laws, including regulations established in the Federal Register.

7. If Held, Summary of Comments Received During Preliminary Comment Period and at Public Hearing on the Statement of Scope:

No preliminary public hearing and comment period were required.

8. Comparison with Similar Rules in Adjacent States:

Fisheries management rules are generally similar in the states surrounding Wisconsin. Neighboring states employ seasons, quotas, gear restrictions, reporting requirements, limitations on the number of licenses, and other regulations to regulate their commercial fishing industry, and have also established license, record-keeping and reporting requirements and other regulations for wholesale fish dealers.

9. Summary of Factual Data and Analytical Methodologies Used and How Any Related Findings Support the Regulatory Approach Chosen:

The Bureaus of Fisheries Management and Law Enforcement evaluated ch. NR 25, Wis. Admin. Code for ways to better organize the provisions that apply to commercial fishers, wholesale fish dealers, or both, as well as to make language less confusing and easier to navigate. All changes are very minor in nature and do not impact the existing operations of commercial fishers and wholesale fish dealers.

10. Analysis and Supporting Documents Used to Determine the Effect on Small Business or in Preparation of an Economic Impact Report:

This rule is anticipated to have no economic impact on small businesses, because it is not making any substantive changes to the regulatory function of rule provisions in ch. NR 25, Wis. Admin. Code.

11. Effect on Small Business (initial regulatory flexibility analysis):

No economic effects are anticipated for small businesses as a result of this rule. In addition, this rule does not impose any new compliance or reporting requirements, nor are any changes to design or operational standards contained in the rule.



NR 25.07 (1) (a), or upon use of the total number of feet of gill net permitted to be set in any time period under subd. 3., a licensee may not set gill nets with a mesh size of 4 7/16 inch stretch measure in water less than 330 feet (55 fathoms) deep for the remainder of the lake trout open season by a licensed commercial fisher upon use of all tags issued for lake trout to the fisher under s. NR 25.07 (1) (a), or upon use of the total number of feet of gill net permitted to be set in any time period under subd. 3.

5. Shall be tagged by the licensed commercial fisher using The licensee using the gill net shall tag the gill net with an informational tag, supplied by the department, on the buoy staff above the water line. Each tag shall state the time and date upon which the gill net was set, the length of the gang of nets, the license number or fleet reporting number and the licensee's initials.

6. <u>May not be placed The licensee may not set or place gill nets</u> in the waters of Lake Superior from a boat or watercraft from January 15 through March 31, except as authorized by the department in a permit issued under sub. (6).

7. May not set or place <u>The licensee may not set or place gill nets</u> within ¼ <u>one-quarter mile</u> shoreward of the pot and lead of any entrapping net, except that if a trap net is set within ¼ <u>one-quarter mile</u> of a gill net, that gill net may continue to be lifted and reset in the same location.
(ar) Gill nets - unrestricted size. With <u>The licensee may set gill nets with</u> no restrictions on mesh size or the number of meshes in depth at any time during the year only in water more than 330

feet (55 fathoms) deep and only when set on the bottom.

(as) *Gill net marking requirements*. Shall be legibly marked <u>The licensee shall legibly mark each</u> gill net with the license number or fleet reporting number of the license holder on each float or on each lead with the license number or fleet reporting number of the commercial fishing license holder to whom it belongs, and shall mark the bowls of the buoys on each end of the gang with the license number of the license holder in accordance with s. 29.516 (2) (d) 1., Stats.

(av) Gill net lifting requirements. Shall be lifted The licensee shall lift each gill net a minimum of:

1. Once every 72 hours (3 days) in open water less than 96 feet (16 fathoms) deep.

2. Once every 120 hours (5 days) in open water 96 to 210 feet (16 to 35 fathoms) deep.

3. Once every 240 hours (10 days) in open water more than 210 feet (35 fathoms) deep.

4. Once every 120 hours (5 days) in commercial ice fishing.

(b) *Entrapping nets.* 1. Only <u>The licensee may use entrapping nets only</u> when the pot or crib is set, placed or operated in water not more than 90 feet (15 fathoms) deep.

2. May be set, placed or operated <u>The licensee may set</u>, place or operate entrapping nets only by permit issued under s. NR 25.10 (4) in that part of Lake Superior lying between a line extending due north of a point one mile east of the mouth of the Iron river in section 34, township 50 north, range 9 west, Bayfield county, and a line extending due north from the mouth of the Bad river in section 17, township 48 north, range 2 west, Ashland county, including all of the Apostle Islands area.

3. May be used up to 10 such nets by each licensed commercial fisher, that being Each licensee may use up to 10 entrapping nets per license, as measured by the maximum number of pots or cribs-allowed.

4. Shall be lifted The licensee shall lift each entrapping net a minimum of once every 168 hours (7 days).

5. <u>Shall Each entrapping net shall</u> have the fish holding pot portion rendered inoperable during the closed seasons for whitefish and lake trout and shall have the webbing removed from the water within 3 days after the close of the lake trout season.

6. May not be placed The licensee may not place entrapping nets within ^{1/2} one-half mile of any other entrapping net.

7. <u>May not be placed or operated The licensee may not place or operate entrapping nets in the</u> waters of Lake Superior during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September if the mesh covering the top of the hearts of the nets is less than 14 inch stretch <u>measure</u>.

8. <u>May not be placed or operated The licensee may not place or operate entrapping nets in the</u> waters of Lake Superior from a boat or water craft watercraft from November 28 through March 31.

9. Entrapment nets fished <u>A licensee fishing with entrapment nets</u> in the area west of Bark Point known as WI-1 may harvest cisco, whitefish, and lake trout less than 25 inches in length, and may only be used from April 1 to September 30.

10. May not be placed or operated The licensee may not place or operate entrapping nets within 4 one mile of a designated trout stream.

11. Shall each be marked and maintained The licensee shall mark and maintain each entrapping net with 2 flags, one above the other, on a single staff attached to the inside or shallow lead end of the net, one flag on a staff attached to the pot or lifting buoy, one flag on a staff attached to the anchor at the outward end of the king line, and one float measuring a minimum of 5 inches in diameter attached to the anchor at the outward end of each net wing. All staffs shall be marked with reflective tape. All flags shall measure not less than 9 inches high by 18 inches wide and shall be displayed so that the top edge of the flag is not less than 5 feet above the water, except that the lower of 2 flags on one staff shall be displayed so that the bottom edge is not less than 3 feet above the water. Two flags displayed on one staff shall be separated by not less than 6 inches. All floats and all flags except the flag attached to the king line anchor shall be of a highly visible color commonly referred to as hunter orange or blaze orange with a color range between 595 nm and 605 nm. The flag attached to the king line anchor shall be a dark color other than orange. The license number or fleet reporting number of the commercial fishing license holder to whom each net belongs shall be displayed and maintained in legible, block figures at least 1 inch high on the bowl of the pot or lifting buoy. Flags are not required October 16 through April 14.

(bm) 1. No net may be placed within <u>1/4 one-quarter</u> mile of any other net, and entrapment except that if a trap net is set illegally within one-quarter mile of a legally placed gill net, that gill net may continue to be lifted and reset in the same location in accordance with par. (am) 7. Entrapment nets are further subject to s. NR 25.09 (1) (b) 6.

SECTION 71. NR 25.09 (2) (a) 1. to 9. and 10. a. are amended to read:

(2) Lake Michigan and Green Bay. (a) Gill nets. 1. With <u>'Gill nets of 1 ³/₄ inch stretch</u> <u>measure for smelt.'</u> For taking smelt only, a licensee may use gill nets with a mesh size of not more than 1³/₄ inch stretch measure not exceeding 60 meshes in depth in Green Bay and 30 meshes in depth in Lake Michigan for taking smelt only.

2. With <u>'Gill nets of 2 $^{3}/_{8}$ to 2 $^{1}/_{2}$ inch stretch measure in southern Green Bay.' In southern Green Bay only, a licensee may use gill nets with a mesh size of not less than $2^{3}/_{8}$ inch and not more than $2^{1}/_{2}$ inch stretch measure not exceeding 60 meshes in depth in southern Green Bay only.</u>

3. With <u>'Gill nets of 2 $\frac{3}{8}$ to 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ inch stretch measure in the southern chub fishing zone in Lake Michigan.' In water more than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep in the southern chub fishing zone in Lake Michigan only except as provided in subd. 4., a licensee may use gill nets with a mesh size of not less than 2³/₈ inch and not more than 2³/₄ inch stretch measure, and not less than 24 meshes and not more than 60 meshes in height, only in the southern chub fishing zone in water more than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep.</u>

a. For chubs in Lake Michigan and Green Bay, <u>a licensee may use gill nets of 2 ¹/₂ to 2 ³/₄ inch stretch measure in the northern chub fishing zone only <u>and those nets may not exceed 60 meshes</u> in depth.</u>

b. For other legal fish species in Lake Michigan and Green Bay, a licensee may use gill nets of 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ to 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ inch stretch measure only in the areas and with the restrictions described under subd. 4. c. and d.

c. May not exceed In Lake Michigan in waters less than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep outside the northern chub fishing zone, a licensee may use gill nets of 2 ¹/₂ to 2 ³/₄ inch stretch measure only

<u>if the gill nets do not exceed</u> 18 meshes in depth when set in waters less than 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep in Lake Michigan outside the northern chub fishing zone.

d. May not exceed In Green Bay, or within the northern chub fishing zone, or in waters 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep or deeper in Lake Michigan, gill nets of 2 ½ to 2 ¾ inch stretch measure may be used only if the gill nets do not exceed 60 meshes in depth when set in Green Bay, or in waters 150 feet (25 fathoms) deep or deeper in Lake Michigan, or within the northern chub fishing zone.

6. With <u>'Gill nets of 4 to 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ inch stretch measure in southern Green Bay.' 


