AN ACT in relation to suits in favor of the Territory.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin.

SECTION 1. The Attorney General is authorized to issue subpænas, and compel the attendance of witnesses on behalf of the Territory, without paying or tendering fees in advance; and any witness failing or neglecting to attend, after being served with a subpæna, may be proceeded against, and shall be liable, in the same manner, as now provided by law in other cases where fees have been paid or tendered.

SEC. 2. The clerk of any court, at which any witness shall have attended on behalf of the Territory, shall give to such witness a certificate of travel and attendance, which shall entitle him to receive the amount from the Territorial treasury.

> SEC. 3. The provisions of the two preceeding sections of this act, shall extend to allasuits and informations brought in the name of the Attorney General, or any other person or persons for the benefit of the Territory.

AN ACT to provide for laying out and establishing. Territorial Reads therein named.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives. of the Territory of Wisconsin.

Read from Prai. Field Chien to Fert Winnebage. Baxter and James S. Albon be appointed Commissioners, in addition to those appointed hy an act approved March 11th, 1839, for the purpose of laying out a Territorial road from Prairie du Chien to Fort Winnebago.

From Madis on to Sac Prairie.

• SEC. 2. A Territorial road shall be laid out and established, running from Madison, the seat of government, on the most direct and eligible route to Sac's Prairie on the Wiscensin river, and that Isaac H. No part of the expenses incurred, or damages as-SEC. 25. Territory or any sessed for laying out said roads, shall be paid from the treasury of any counties through which said road may pass, nor shall say part thereof be paid out of the Territorial Treasury.

AN ACT to provide for the support of common schools, and for other purposes.

Tax to be assessed for school purposes.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Ren-SECTION 1. resentatives of the Territory of Wisconsin, That, for the botter support and maintainance of common schools in this Territory it shall be the duty of the county commissioners, of each organ. ized county, to add to the tax list, for the current expenses of each year, such sum as may be equal to one-fourth of one por cent. upon the assessment roll for the same year and to include that same in their warrant to the collector, and the said collector shall
