

An act to declare the Fond du Lac river a navigable stream.

Chap 104

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That so much of Fond du Lac river as lies between the mouth of said river and the forks, is hereby made and declared to be a navigable stream. Declared navigable.

SEC. 2. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to build or construct any bridge or dam across said river, or in any other manner to obstruct the navigation of said river. Not to obstruct, &c.

SECTION 1. The name of the town of Butte des Morte, in the county of Winnebago, is hereby changed to Bloomingdale, by which name it shall hereafter be known in all places whatsoever. Bloomingdale

An act to establish a state road from Fond du Lac to Port Washington.

Chap 106

THE People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That Homer Johnson, Jonathan T. Danforth, and Marvin Buckland are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from Fond du Lac, in Fond du Lac county, to Port Washington, in Washington county.
