

Chap 138 An act to alter the boundaries of certain towns, in the county of Marquette.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Boundaries of towns, &c.

SECTION 1. So much of the county of Marquette as lies north and west of the town of Buffalo is hereby attached to said town: so much of the county of Marquette as lies north of the town of Marquette is hereby attached to the town Marquette: so much of the county of Marquette as lies north of the town of Pleasant Valley is hereby attached to the town of Pleasant Valley: so much of the county of Marquette as lies north of the town of Berlin is hereby attached to the town of Berlin.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chap 139 An act to authorize the laying out of a certain road in the town of Madison.

THE people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

To lay out road.

SECTION 1. The highway commissioners of the town of Madison, in Dane county, are hereby authorized to lay out: and establish a certain road in said town, commencing at the east end of King street and running eastwardly on the most convenient ground until it intersects with Fort Winnebago road, near the bridge that crosses the outlet of the Fourth Lake.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chap 140 An act declaring a certain road in the town of Rosendale in Fond du Lac county, to be a lawful highway.

THE people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Declared lawful.

SECTION 1. A certain road in the town of Rosendale, in Fond du Lac county, laid out by the highway commissioners of said town, on the twelfth day of December in the year of our Lord one

thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, is hereby declared to be a lawful highway.

SEC. 2. Said highway is described as follows, to wit: beginning at the northwest corner of section thirty-one in said town, and running east on the section line to within seven rods of the quarter post, on the north side of section thirty-four, thence southeasterly across the northeast quarter of section thirty-four and the northwest quarter of section thirty-five to the quarter section line, forty-two rods east of the quarter post, on the west side of section thirty-five, thence east on said quarter section line to the east side of the said town of Rosendale.

Description.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

An act relative to seals.

Chap 141

THE people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The description in writing of the great seal of the state shall be deposited and recorded in the office of the secretary of state, and shall remain a public record, and shall be and continue the description of the great seal of the state; and the person administering the government of the state shall have the custody of the said seal, and all such matters and things as issue under the said seal shall be entered of record in the office of the secretary of state.

Description of seal to be recorded.

SEC. 2. It shall be and hereby is made the duty of the board of supervisors of the several counties of this state, to provide and furnish seals for such of the several circuit, county and probate courts as are now unprovided with the same, and with such inscriptions and devices as the said courts shall respectively require.

Board of supervisors to furnish seals.

SEC. 3. When any court of record shall be unprovided with a seal, the judge of said court may authorize the use of any temporary seal, or of any device by way of seal, until the same shall be provided as aforesaid.

Temporary seal authorized.

SEC. 4. Any instrument to which the person making the same shall affix any device by way of seal, shall be adjudged and held to be of the same force and obligation as if it were actually sealed.

SEC. 5. The great seal of the territory of Wisconsin is hereby
