

An act concerning the publication of the decisions of the Supreme Court of the late Territory of Wisconsin. Chap 203

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Andrew G. Miller of the city of Milwaukee, is hereby authorized to publish the decisions of the supreme court of the late territory of Wisconsin, and the copy right thereof is hereby granted to him. Authorized to publish.

SEC. 2. The librarian or superintendent of public property is hereby authorized and required to deliver to said Andrew G. Miller the manuscript copies of papers and opinions that were obtained from the heirs or representatives of the estate of Thomas P. Burnett deceased, and the clerk of the supreme court is hereby authorized and required to deliver to said Andrew G. Miller all or any part desired by him, of the original papers and opinions on file in his office, taking a receipt therefor to be returned into his office as soon as the said reports are published. Librarian to deliver copy.

SEC. 3. The faith of the state is not in any manner pledged to contribute towards the expenses of the said publication.

An act to authorize the trustees of Plum Grove school district, in the town of Cassville, Grant county, to levy a tax to build a school house. Chap 204

THE People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The trustees of the Plum Grove school district in the town of Cassville, Grant county, are hereby authorized to levy a tax on the property in the said school district to build a school house: *Provided*, That said sum to be raised shall not exceed three hundred dollars. To levy tax.

SEC. 2. The said tax is to be levied and collected as is provided by law for the levying and collection of other taxes.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect whenever the legal voters of such school district at a meeting held for that purpose, shall cast a majority of votes in favor of levying the said tax. When to take effect.
