An Act to provide for the laying out of certain state roads therein named. Chap 27.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate

and Assembly, do enact as follows:
SECTION 1. That Abraham Brawley and John T. Kingston, of Commis'rs. Portage county, William Polly of Crawford county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from Black river, in town twenty-four (24) north, range two (2) west, section sixteen (16), to the Shaurette mills at Steven's Point, on the Wisconsin river in Portage county.

SEC. 2. That the expenses of the laying out and surveying Expenses of said road shall be paid by the several counties of Crawford and how paid. Portage, in proportion to the length of the same in the said counties respectively.

SEC. 3. That Silas Hermstreet, George W. Martin, and Sylvester Commis'rs.

Taylor be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from Neosho, in Dodge county, to the court house at or near the centre of said county: Provided. that no part of the expense of surveying or laying out said road shall be paid out of the state or county treasury.
