Chap. 6. Joint Resolutions relative to a proposed amendment to the constitution of the United States, concerning Postmasters.

Whereas, It is more in accordance with our republican institutions to give the people the power of election of all officers of

government, as far as practicable: Therefore

Resolved, That our senators in congress be instructed and our representatives requested, to propose in congress such an amendment to the constitution of the United States, as will confer upon the people the power of electing all postmasters.

Chap. 7.

Joint Resolutions relative to the Public Lands.

Resolved, by the Scnate and Assembly of the State of Wisconsin: That the toleration and protection by the government of the monopoly of the soil in this country, is greatly to be deplored, and we believe it inexpedient and unjust for our national government to dispose of the public domain to any persons except actual settlers.

Resolved, That our senators in congress be and they hereby are instructed and our representatives requested, to use all their influence to secure the passage of a law transferring to the several states all public lands lying within the same, on condition that the said lands shall be conveyed to actual settlers only, and in limited quantities, for a price not exceeding cost and transfer; and for the survey of lands lying in the territories, into loss suitable for farming or village purposes, and the conveyance of the same to actual settlers only, and in limited quantities free of cost.

Resolved, That the governor is hereby requested, immediately upon the passage of these resolutions, to forward a copy to each

of our senators and representatives in congress.
