SEC. 3. The said tax shall be levied and collected in all respects in the same manner as other taxes are by law collected. How collected.

An Act to change the time of holding the County Court for the county of Kenosha.

Chap. 10.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The County Court for the county of Kenosha, shall hereafter be held on the fourth Monday in March, June, September and December, in each year, instead of the time heretofore required by law. Court when held.

SEC. 2. All process and other proceedings in said Court made returnable on the first Monday in April, eighteen hundred and fifty-one, shall be considered and held as returnable on the fourth Monday in March, eighteen hundred and fifty-one, and all appearances, adjournments, motions, notices and other proceedings pending in said Court, shall be considered and held as made and taken to the March term thereof. SEC. 3. So much of any and all former acts as conflict with the provisions of this act is hereby repealed.

An Act relating to the village of Madison.

Chap. 11.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That the Treasurer of the village of Madison is authorised, and it is hereby made his duty, to sell all lands or lots in said village upon which the taxes shall remain unpaid on Treasurer to sell lands.

SEC. 2. If any lots or lands shall remain unsold, it shall be the duty of the Treasurer to return a delinquent list to the Clerk of said village, on or before the fourth Monday of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.
