### Chap. 133

An Act to incorporate the Female Normal Institute and High School at Milwaukee.

*The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate  
and Assembly do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. That I. A. Lapham, J. P. Greves, G. P. Hew-  
ett, J. H. Tweedy, A. Finch, Jr., G. J. Fowler, J. H. Van  
Dyke, W. P. Flanders, W. L. Parsons and their successors,

tees. are hereby created a body corporate and politic, with the name  
and style of the "Normal Institute and High School," and shall  
be trustees of said corporation, for the purpose of the edu-  
cation of females, and for that purpose to remain in perpetual  
succession.

SEC. 2. Said corporation shall have all the powers and  
privileges, and be subject to the restrictions and liabilities of  
chapter fifty-four, of the statutes of Wisconsin, entitled general  
provisions relating to corporations.

SEC. 3. The said trustees and their successors shall have

power and authority to direct and prescribe the course of study and discipline in said institution; and also to select and appoint <sup>Powers of trustee.</sup> a president, and such professors and tutors, and such other officers as said trustees shall deem proper; all of whom shall hold their offices during the pleasure of said trustees.

SEC. 4. The said trustees and their successors shall have power and authority to grant such literary honors and degrees as are usually granted by colleges and seminaries of learning in the United States, and in testimony of such grants to give suitable diplomas under their seals, which diplomas shall entitle the possessors respectively, to the immunities and privileges which by usage or statute are allowed to the possessors of similar diplomas granted by colleges and seminaries of learning.

SEC. 5. Said trustees shall also have authority to establish a normal department of said institution, for the education and <sup>Of normal department.</sup> training of female teachers, under such regulations as they may from time to time prescribe.

SEC. 6. Said trustees shall continue in office during their life or pleasure, unless removed as hereinafter provided; and shall have power to fill all vacancies occasioned by death, resignation or otherwise; and to increase their number to fifteen <sup>Trustees may fill vacancies.</sup> at their discretion. Any trustee may be removed by a vote of two-thirds of the board, for mal-conduct or for neglect of duty for one year.

SEC. 7. The trustees shall faithfully apply all funds by them collected or received, or the proceeds thereof, according to the best of their judgment, in erecting buildings, supporting the <sup>Of funds and their management.</sup> necessary officers, instructors and servants, in procuring books and apparatus, and such other purposes as are necessary for the success of the institution.

SEC. 8. Said corporation shall have power to hold real estate sufficient for all necessary purposes connected with the institution.

Chap. 134

*The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The Madison, Watertown and Milwaukee Plank Road Company is hereby authorised under the laws of its incorporation, and amendatory thereto to construct a branch of said road running from a point in said road near the Junction House
