The Secretary of State, on receiving any reports, Mapa, ac, to be SEC. 2. plats or maps made by any appraisers of school and university lands, shall employ competent draftsmen to record the same in the manner provided in section forty of chapter twenty-four of the Revised Statutes, the expense of which record shall be paid out of the income of the fund to which said reports, plats or maps may belong.

Ar Act to lay out a State road from the village of Madison in the county of Dane, to the quarter stake on section number thirty six, township number nine, north of range number two east, in the county of Richland.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That Orrin B. Hazzletine of Dane county, Gar. Commissioners wood Greene of Richland county and John T. Jones of Iowa out a road. county, be and are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a State road, beginning at Madison in the county of Dane, and running westerly by the head of Fourth Lake, thence to Black Earth Valley, (the north side of John W. Direction of Thomas' house, where the county road now runs from,) thence Road. down said valley to Arena, thence westerly crossing the Wisconsin river, thence on the nearest and best ground to the east line of Richland county, at the guarter stake on section number thirty-six, township number nine north, of range number two east.

SEC. 2. The commissioners appointed under the provisions County Super-of this act, shall upon the performance of the work be entitled compensation. to such compensation for their services as the Supervisors of the counties where such services are performed shall deem just and proper: Provided, that no part of the expense of laving Proviso. out said road shall be paid out of the State treasury.
