An Act to change the name of the town of Plymouth.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Name changed to Quitquire,

SECTION 1. The name of the town of Plymouth in the county of Sheboygan is hereby changed to Quitquire, and it shall hereafter be known by that name in law and otherwise.

An Act for the relief of the town of Alto.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows :

Certain road declared highway

SECTION 1. That all roads heretofore laid out and established by the proper officers of the town of Alto, in the county of Fond du Lac, are hereby declared to be a public highway: Provided, That this act shall not affect any road which may have been discontinued by such officers.

Proviso.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
