

that said premises shall be used for the purposes of a light-house, and the necessary fixtures and improvements for its preservation and maintenance; and that when the United States shall cease to use said premises for the purposes herein specified, the same shall revert to the State of Wisconsin for the use of schools.

Chap. 22.

An Act in relation to the publication of legal notices.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That in all cases where any legal notice is required by law to be published in any newspaper in any county in this State, and no public newspaper is printed in said county, such notice shall be required to be published in a newspaper printed in an adjoining county, if a newspaper be printed therein.

SEC. 2. That all the laws of this state inconsistent with the foregoing provisions, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Chap. 23.

An Act to establish the Emerald Grove Academy.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Corporate Powers.

SECTION 1. That Erastus Dean, William Hume, Orren Densmore, Charles C. Cheney, Asa G. Ransom, Russel Cheney, James Silburn, and Benjamin Fowl, and their associates, together with such persons as may hereafter be associated with them, be, and are hereby, created a body corporate and politic, with perpetual succession, to be styled by the name and title of the Emerald Grove Academy, by which name they and their successors shall be ever known, and shall have power to sue and be sued, to contract and be contracted with, plead and be impleaded, defend and be defended in all courts of law and
