An Act in relation to Smelters

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. That from and after the first day of June next, smelters and every smelter, and every purchaser of lead or copper ore incertain accounts the State, shall keep a substantially bound book, divided into suitable columns, in which shall be entered, from day to day as' the ore is received, the following items, to wit: the day, month and year when the ore is so received; the name of the person of whom the ore is purchased; the name of the person who hauls or brings it to the furnace or other place of delivery; the name of the owner of the ground from which the ore is raised or obtained, and if the owner is not known, then the name of the diggings to be given, or the ground in some way described distinctly

SEC. 2. Said book shall be kept at the jurnace, or at the where book to usual place of business of the purchaser, smelter, or his agent, and shall be open to all persons at reasonable times for inspection and taking extracts.

SEC. 3. If any purchaser, smelter, or agent of the pur Penalty for fulchaser or smelter, shall fail to keep such book, or to make such book. entries, or shall unreasonably refuse to show the same for inspection, or shall make false entries therein, he shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars for every such offence, and for each day that he may fail to keep such book, separate actions may be brought for the penalty above named, on complaint made by any person, verified by affidavit that the statute has been violated, any Justice of the Peace in the county shall issue his su mmons against the person complained of in the case.

An Act for the laying out of a StateBoad in the county of Dodge.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senata and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Spencer Givens, Charles Billinghurst and John C. Lewis, are hereby appointed Commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from the village of Dodge Contro in the county of Dodge, to the village of Hustisford in said county, upon the most direct and practicable route.

SEC. 2. The said Commissioners shall be entitled to receive for laying out said road such compensation as the beard of Supervisors of the county of Dodge may deem sufficient: Provided, no part of the expense for the laying out of said road shall be paid out of the State Treasury.
