Stock to vote.

SEC. 5. At all elections and meetings of the company each stockholder shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock owned by him.

Stockho'ders may pass orders

SEC. 6. The stockholders may, at any annual or special meeting, pass such orders in relation to the concerns of said corporation, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this State, as they may deem proper.

Central and specific power of trustees.

SEC. 7. The trustees shall have power—first, to elect from their number a President, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall hold their offices for one year and until their successors are chosen; also, to elect all other officers of the corporation. Secondly, to call special meetings of the stockholders to fill vacancies in the board of trustees. Thirdly, to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of any real or personal property of said corporation in such manner as shall be directed by the stockholders; also, to erect and keep in repair all necessary buildings for the use of said corporation. Fourthly, to employ suitable teachers and prescribe and direct the course of study and discipline to be observed in said academy. Fifthly, to prescribe the duties and fix the salaries of all the officers of said corporation, and remove or suspend them from office for incapacity, immoral conduct or misbehavior in office, and to appoint others Sixthly, to make all rules, regulations and byin their places. laws necessary or proper to carry into effect the powers herein granted, and not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of this State.

Religious tests not to be rereired. SEC. 8. No religious test or qualification shall be required of any trustee or officer of said corporation, nor of any student of said institution.

SEC. 9. This act may be altered or amended by any future legislature.

county.

SEC. 2. The commissioners shall be entitled to such com-supervisors pensation for their services, from the counties through which pensation. the road passes, as the supervisors of said counties shall deem just : Provided, the State shall be at no expense for the same. Proviso.
