An Act in relation to public printing.

Chap. 47.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. That the person or persons who now or hereafter may have any contract or contracts for doing any or all the public printing of this State, are hereby required, immediately after performing any such printing, to deposite with the Secretary of State a copy of such journal, bill, memorial, report, or any other printed document or paper coming under the class of "incidental printing," with the number of such copies printed, the number of "ems" composing the same, and the whole price of the said number of copies marked thereon; and there shall also be deposited in a similar manner a copy of each "form" contractor to of the laws and journals, together with the number of "ems" deposite copies. composing the same, and also a copy of each "blank" furnished the Executive or any of the departments of the State; and in case other printing than "blanks" are so furnished to the Executive or any of the departments of the State, a copy of the same shall be deposited with the Secretary of State in the same manner as is above provided for the incidental printing, or the printing of the laws and journals, as the case may be.
